Severe Weather Outlook

- For over a week, relentless severe weather has been torturing states across America. That trend will continue Thursday, with the bulk of the central U.S. facing another day of dangerous storms.
- The worst of the storms will likely be concentrated in western North Texas, including the Fort Worth area, but areas



from Wisconsin and Michigan to Louisiana and Mississippi could see storms that produce tornadoes, damaging wind gusts and large hail.

- As the storms progress overnight, they will lose their severe components and transform into heavy rainmakers.
- In addition, intense rain could lead to flash flooding across parts of Texas, which has seen nearly a foot of rain. Additional rainfall totals between 2 and 3 inches are expected through Thursday.
- People in parts of East Texas have already been told to evacuate as rivers leave their banks.
- Flood Watches cover much of Central and East Texas, from Waco to Houston with parts of Louisiana also included.
- Large hail, damaging winds and an isolated tornado are possible from late Friday into Saturday morning over parts of the central and southern Plains.
