

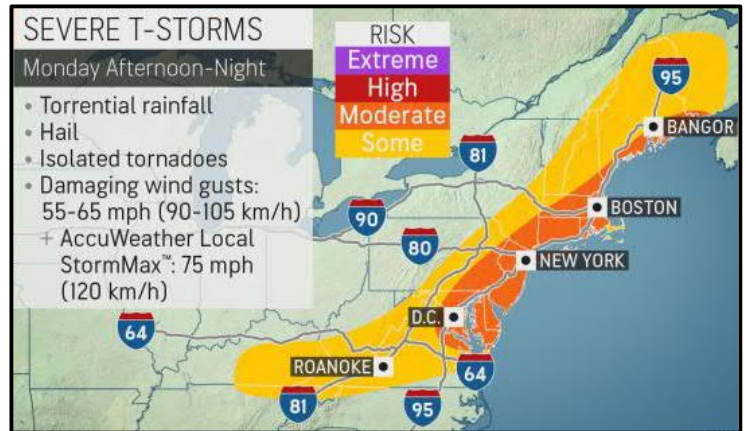

Severe Weather Outlook

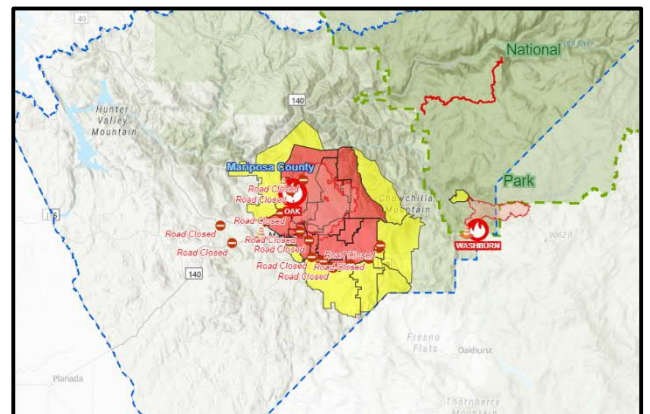
- AccuWeather forecasters say intense, severe thunderstorms will move through much of the Midwest, mid-Atlantic and Northeast on Monday.
- As the cold front responsible for the unsettled weather tracks eastward, severe storms are forecast to erupt along the heavily populated Interstate 95 corridor.
- More than 52 million will be at risk of potentially damaging storms on Monday in a moderate severe weather risk area that forecasters say stretches from northeastern Virginia to Maine.
- As ongoing storms track eastward and begin to strengthen during the early afternoon, western areas will be the first to see a threat of severe weather. In cities such as Charleston, West Virginia, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, and Albany, New York, outdoor plans may need to be altered as storms roll through.
- As storms track farther east toward the major coastal cities, they're likely to grow more widespread and intense.
- Toward the southwest, additional storms are also likely to form in Virginia and along the heavily traveled Interstate 81 corridor.
- Damaging wind gusts, hail and flooding rainfall will be the main threats with any Monday storms, forecasters say.



Wildfire Activity

California – Oak Fire

- The fast-moving Oak Fire forced thousands of California residents to flee from their properties over the weekend and additional fires continued to threaten more trails of destruction in the Golden State.
- In Mariposa County, approximately 75 miles north of Fresno and 150 miles southeast of Sacramento, the raging Oak Fire has burned through more than 15,000 acres as of Monday morning. Throughout the weekend, more than 3,000 residents were forced to flee their homes.
- The fire started Friday in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada Mountain range and has continued to spread rapidly, remaining at 0% containment as of Monday.
- After igniting around 2 p.m., PDT, Friday near the community of Midpines, the fire quickly moved to the Sierra National Forest, burning through a mass amount of trees.

- Sunday morning, Cal Fire stated that 10 structures have been destroyed due to the flames, with five more damaged and 2,693 still under threat.
- The Oak Fire is by far the largest of California's four ongoing wildfires with 14,281 acres burned, eclipsing Amador County's Electra Fire by nearly 10,000 acres (4,478 acres burned with 99% containment as of Friday).
- Due to the dire situation in Mariposa County, California Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency for the county Saturday, with Newsom's office stating that California was handed a Fire Management Assistance Grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to gain fire-suppressing resources.
