

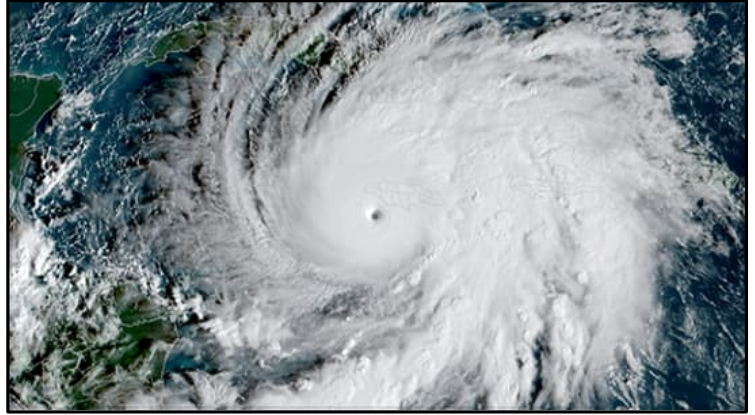

Atlantic Tropical Activity Hurricane Melissa (Cat 2)

- With Hurricane Melissa's rapid intensification, the 2025 Atlantic hurricane season has produced three Category 5 hurricanes, which hasn't happened in a single season for 20 years.
- Melissa continues to make history as the third-strongest hurricane ever recorded in the Atlantic Basin following Erin (Aug. 16) and Humberto (Sept. 27).
- Hurricane Melissa had sustained winds of 185 mph on Tuesday morning.
- This is only the second time in modern history to have more than two Category 5 storms in one season. The last time it happened was in 2005, with four Category 5 hurricanes.
- FOX Weather Hurricane Specialist Bryan Norcross said the number of named storms, including major hurricanes, stronger than a Category 3, was on track with what most models predicted this season, including new artificial intelligence (AI) models.
- Hurricane Humberto underwent rapid intensification in September, becoming a monster Category 5 storm.
- The storm did not make landfall but produced life-threatening surf and rip currents along the East Coast.
- In August, Hurricane Erin was the first hurricane of the 2025 Atlantic season and reached Category 5 strength with 160-mph winds moving north of the Caribbean islands.
