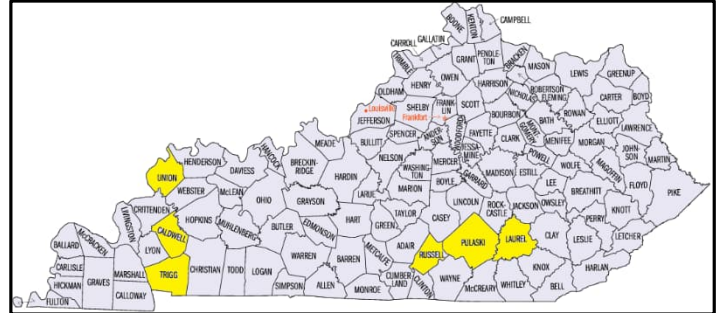

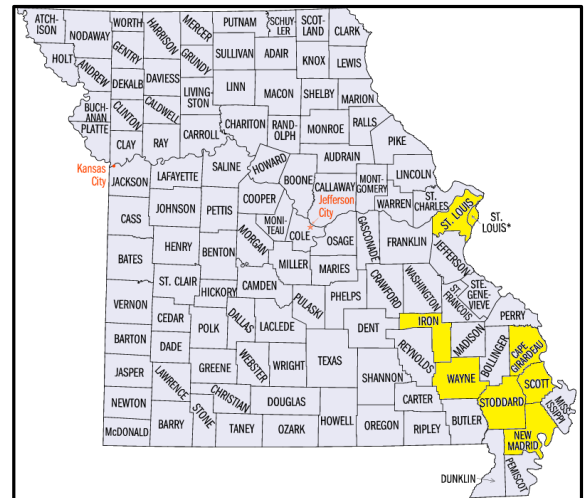
DR 4875 Kentucky

- On May 24, President Donald Trump approved individual assistance for 6 counties in Kentucky.
- On May 20, Gov. Andy Beshear requested an expedited major disaster declaration due to severe storms, tornadoes, straight-line winds, landslides, and flooding that began May 16, 2025. He requested individual assistance for the following eight counties: Caldwell, Christian, Laurel, Pulaski, Todd, Trigg and Union.
- This event produced significant rainfall, widespread deadly tornadic activity, hurricane-force winds, and large damaging hail.
- On May 16, Gov. Andy Beshear declared a state of emergency ahead of dangerous weather system.
- There were 19 fatalities and 96 injuries.
- Aerial photography compared with pre-disaster photos indicates the likelihood that over 1,500 homes have been either destroyed or received major damage.



Disaster Declaration Request Missouri

- On May 26, Governor Mike Kehoe requested that President Donald J. Trump approve a major disaster declaration to provide federal assistance to the City of St. Louis, St. Louis County and six southeast Missouri counties – Cape Girardeau, Iron, New Madrid, Scott, Stoddard and Wayne, in response to the severe storms and tornadoes that devastated these areas on May 16, claiming seven lives and causing widespread destruction of homes, businesses and public infrastructure.
- A powerful storm system brought severe weather across Missouri and Illinois on May 16th, causing a destructive tornado and producing widespread damage.
- Officials say the tornado touched down in Clayton, skipped into Richmond Heights, clipped Forest Park and continued east across the Mississippi River into Illinois.
- The National Weather Service tornado damage survey revealed that the deadly tornado that struck Blodgett, MO, in Scott County, was an EF-3, reaching peak winds of 152 miles per hour. It was on the ground for around 20 minutes, covering just over 16 miles, beginning around 3:54 pm, Friday, May 16.
