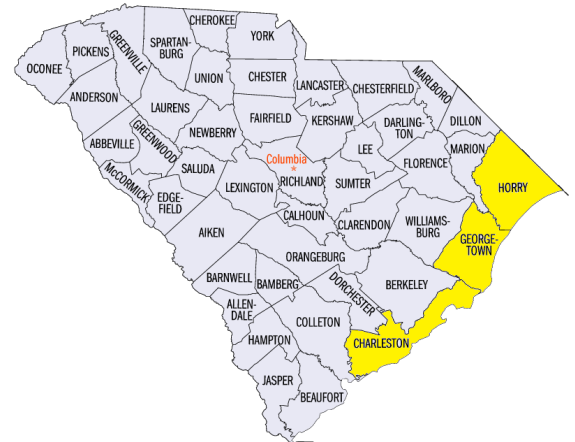

Declaration Activity

DR-4677 South Carolina

- Residents in Horry, Georgetown and Charleston counties can now apply for federal aid to recover from Hurricane Ian.
- On Tuesday, President Joe Biden approved the South Carolina Disaster Declaration, declaring a major disaster exists in the State of South Carolina.
- Governor McMaster requested a presidential disaster declaration on Nov. 1.
- McMaster made the request after extensive damage assessments by the South Carolina Emergency Management Division and the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
- According to the governor's office, the assessments found 17 homes destroyed, 232 homes with major damage and 82 homes with minor damage due to Ian.
- The declaration makes federal aid available to supplement state and local recovery efforts in the areas affected by Hurricane Ian during the period of September 25 to October 4.



Disaster Update

DR-4673 Florida

- FEMA announced that Hurricane Ian survivors who suffered damage to their property have additional time to apply for federal disaster assistance, with the application deadline extended to Jan. 12, 2023.
- The agency also announced that more than \$2.69 billion in federal grants, disaster loans and flood insurance payments has been provided to the state of Florida and households after Hurricane Ian.
- FEMA has provided \$752 million to households and \$327 million to the state for emergency response and recovery, while the U.S. Small Business Administration has provided \$962 million in disaster loans and the National Flood Insurance Program has paid \$652 million in claims.
- Residents in Brevard, Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Flagler, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Hillsborough, Lake, Lee, Manatee, Monroe, Okeechobee, Orange, Osceola, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, Putnam, Sarasota, Seminole, St. Johns and Volusia counties are eligible to apply for Individual Assistance.
- 34 Disaster Recovery Centers are operating in impacted areas, with more than 70,000 visits by survivors.
- FEMA is providing Transitional Sheltering Assistance in 26 counties to survivors eligible for temporary hotel stays. As of today, the program is providing housing for 1,687 households with 4,192 members.
