

Severe Weather Outlook

- Another day of active severe weather will be likely throughout the central Plains today as a potent spring system pushes into the nation's midsection.
- The main threats will be damaging winds, large hail and even tornadoes.
- The Storm Prediction Center has issued an Enhanced Risk for severe weather across parts of the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles, western Kansas and central Nebraska today.



- On Saturday, the risk of severe thunderstorms will push farther to the east into an area with a larger population.
- Storms are predicted to rumble over the lower Plains, the upper portion of the Mississippi Valley and the western part of the Great Lakes.
- All facets of severe weather will be possible on Saturday afternoon and evening. Meteorologists
 expect the storms to unleash anything from high winds and large hail to localized flash flooding
 and a few tornadoes.
- The major metro areas of Minneapolis; Des Moines, Iowa; Kansas City, Missouri; Topeka, Kansas; and Oklahoma City may be affected by a severe thunderstorm as a cold front approaches from the west.
- The risk of severe weather is expected to diminish on Sunday and Monday as the cold front pushes slowly across the Great Lakes and the Ohio Valley. Still, a few storms can be locally heavy and gusty as they cross the Chicago, Indianapolis and Detroit metro areas.

Wildfire Activity

<u>Arizona – Tunnel Fire (Coconino County)</u>

- The Tunnel Fire, which is burning across an area about 14 miles northeast of Flagstaff, exploded in size since it was first reported late Sunday afternoon.
- On Tuesday afternoon, the fire was measured at more than 6,000 acres, but with no
 containment, the blaze grew to 20,198 acres by Friday morning more than tripling in size,
 according to an update from InciWeb.
- In a statement Thursday night, the Coconino County Sheriff's Office said deputies have conducted preliminary evaluations of the burn area. Approximately 109 properties were impacted by the fire, including 30 residences that were burned and 24 properties with outbuildings destroyed.
- Current evacuation orders remain in place until further notice. County officials have deemed it unsafe to allow residents back into the evacuated area at this time.

- Erratic winds are in the forecast Friday and Saturday, which also played a part in the decision to keep evacuation orders in place, according to Coconino County officials.
- Arizona Gov. Doug Ducey declared a state of emergency in Coconino County due to the 20,000acre Tunnel wildfire.
