

Flood Activity Alabama

- On October 6th, 2021, a major flash flood event occurred across the state of Alabama.
- Parts of Jefferson County experienced upwards of 10 inches of rainfall in some areas, which fell in a short period of time. This resulted in flash flooding in several areas of the county.
- In addition, this heavy rain over the span of a few days led to the death of at least four people in Central Alabama.
- About 20 people were rescued from vehicles and more than 80 were rescued from flooding homes, officials said.
- Emergency management officials have assessed damage to two hundred and fifty homes near Birmingham in Shelby County.
- Officials with the Jefferson County EMA said FEMA crews and state crews are going over hundreds of damage claims.
- This is just another step in the process of declaring a disaster and potentially getting FEMA federal dollars for cities and homeowners.
