Severe Weather Outlook

- A slow-moving weather system will produce dual threats of severe thunderstorms and flooding rain from parts of the Southern and Central Plains into the Midwest through midweek.
- The threat of severe weather will begin in the Central and Southern Plains on Tuesday afternoon and continue into the evening hours.
- Areas from south-central Kansas into western and central Oklahoma and western Texas have the greatest chance of seeing severe

thunderstorms. Parts of this region could see supercell thunderstorms develop, which could produce large hail, damaging winds and some tornadoes.

- A widespread area from Texas into parts of the mid-Mississippi and Ohio valleys will see showers and thunderstorms from Wednesday into Thursday.
- Heavy rainfall is possible in some areas, and that might trigger at least localized flash flooding.

Declaration Activity

Kentucky

- Two weeks after Gov. Beshear requested a major disaster declaration after devastating flooding, the White House ordered federal assistance to Kentucky.
- From Feb. 26 to March 1, Kentucky experienced some of the greatest one-day and three-day winter rainfall totals in history, exceeding seven inches in several Southcentral and Southeastern Kentucky counties.
- Flooding occurred on the Green, Kentucky, Licking, Ohio, Rolling Fork and Mississippi rivers. State roads in 21 counties closed due to flooding, mudslides and pavement breaks.
- The Governor issued a State of Emergency Order Feb. 28. Forty-nine counties and 31 cities also declared states of emergency.
- FEMA conducted joint damage assessments and subsequently awarded individuals and households assistance for more than 2,300 impacted homes in the counties of Breathitt, Clay, Estill, Floyd, Johnson, Lee, Magoffin, Martin and Powell. The federal Disaster Declaration includes activation of the individuals and households Assistance Program for these impacted counties.
- Of the 2,300 homes in nine counties where FEMA validated at least some impact from the high water, 622 had major damage or were destroyed, according to the state's application.


