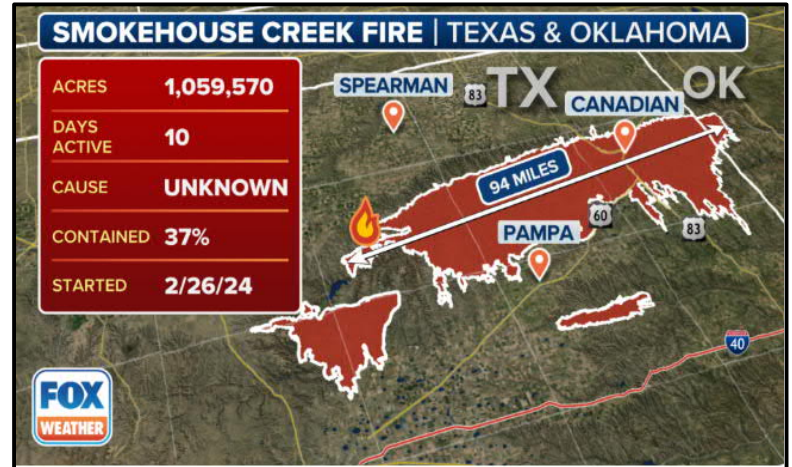

March 6, 2024

Fire Activity

Texas

- On Tuesday, the Texas A&M Forest Service said the inferno was an estimated 1.059 million acres.
- The agency said the size of the fire was lower than its last estimate of 1.076 million acres because of additional data collection and more accurate mapping.
- The fire was 37% contained, according to the forest service.
- Texas Gov. Greg Abbott urged Texans to maintain their guard, as the fire will continue to be a considerable threat.
- The Smokehouse Creek fire quadrupled in size in less than 48 hours, catching officials, civilians and farmers off guard and unable to prevent widespread damage.
- "Cooler temperatures and less wind will aid in the ongoing suppression efforts for active wildfires," the Forest Service said Monday.
- Also "An underlying risk for new wildfires will continue in the Texas Panhandle and South Texas until spring green-up in occurs in the abundance of grass vegetation found in these regions."
- In Hutchinson County, 332 homes were reported as affected, 5 with major damage and 135 destroyed.
