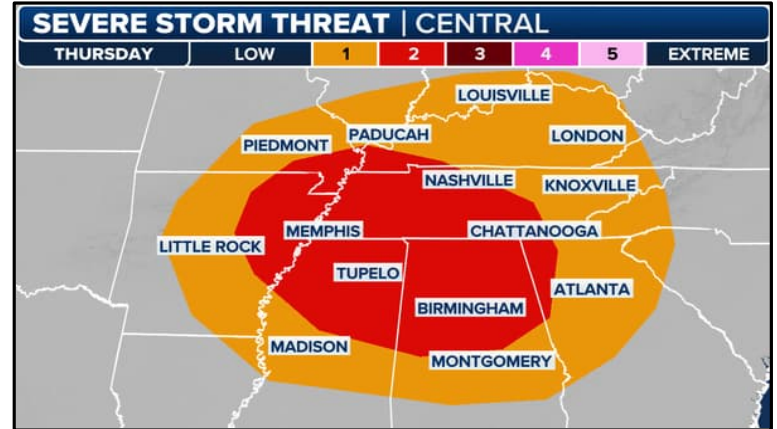

Severe Weather Outlook

Central U.S.

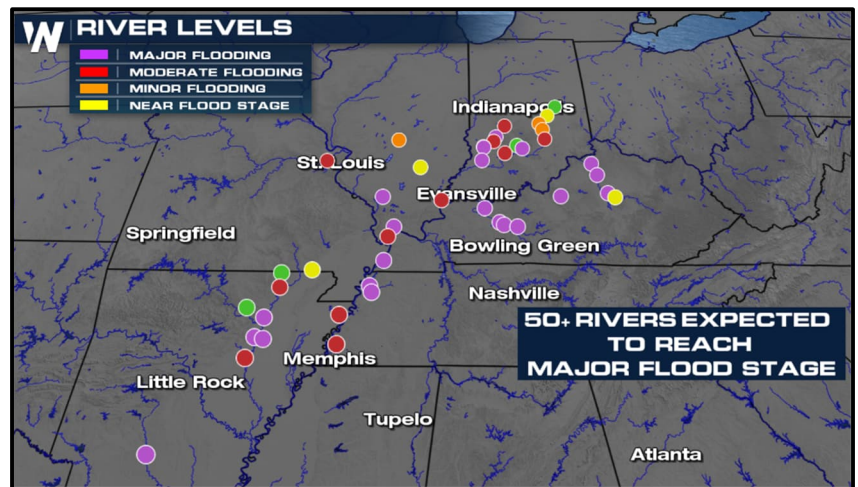
- Communities in the Midwest and South that are still reeling from historic flooding, and deadly storms are bracing for more severe weather this week.
- Nearly 30 million people across portions of the mid-South and Deep South and Tennessee Valley will be at risk of scattered severe thunderstorms on Thursday.
- In Tennessee, this includes cities like Memphis, Nashville and Chattanooga. Birmingham and Huntsville in Alabama are also at risk on Thursday.
- Forecasters say the main threats will be damaging wind gusts and large hail, but some tornadoes cannot be ruled out.



Flood Activity

Central U.S.

- Some residents were beginning to return home after major flooding forced evacuations. Officials were hoping that by the end of Wednesday, most displaced people could return to see what kind of damage the floodwaters did to their homes.
- While the storms are over, the flood danger continues throughout the South and Ohio Valley.
- The Ohio River is set to crest in Louisville Wednesday, marking one of the ten worst flood events in city history, officials have said.
- The National Water Prediction Service forecasts the Ohio River at the upper portion of the McAlpine Locks and Dam to crest at 37 feet Wednesday. The lower portion of the dam is expected to crest at 68.4 feet Wednesday, according to forecasters.
- Tennessee is bracing for a spring weather alert as the Mississippi River near Memphis sees rising waters, triggering a flood warning that will last until April 23.
- According to the National Weather Service, the Mississippi River at Memphis is expected to rise to 36.5 feet by early next week, crossing the flood stage of 34 feet.
