
Severe Weather Outlook The Plains and Midwest

- Daily rounds of storms will bring the risk of strong winds and flash flooding from portions of the Plains and Midwest to parts of the Northeast.
- Risks will be particularly high on Monday when a rare severe weather event known as a derecho could blast several states and threaten major cities.
- As the cold front continues to move south and eastward on Monday, it will interact with increasing moisture and heat ahead of it promoting an immensely unstable atmosphere for thunderstorms to develop and feed from.
- Widespread destructive wind gusts will be a primary hazard with wind gusts as high as 90 mph and an AccuWeather Local StormMax™ of 115 mph.
- Other hazards including flash flooding, large hail and isolated tornadoes will also be possible in severe thunderstorms.
- The complex thunderstorms may continue into Tuesday morning.
- Risk for severe thunderstorms across the Plains and Midwest will continue Tuesday afternoon and night stretching from Wyoming to portions of far western lowa and Missouri.

Tropical Activity

<u>Central Pacific – Tropical Storm Iona</u>

- Tropical Storm Iona formed south of Hawaii in the Central Pacific Ocean on Sunday evening.
- Tropical Storm Iona's maximum sustained winds reached 40 mph, officially designating it as a tropical storm.
- Located about 960 miles southeast of Honolulu and is moving off to the west at 10 mph, with maximum sustained wind speeds of 50 mph.
- Iona is expected to strengthen over the next 48 hours and develop into a hurricane by Monday night, before weakening Tuesday and is expected to stay well south of the Hawaiian Islands.
