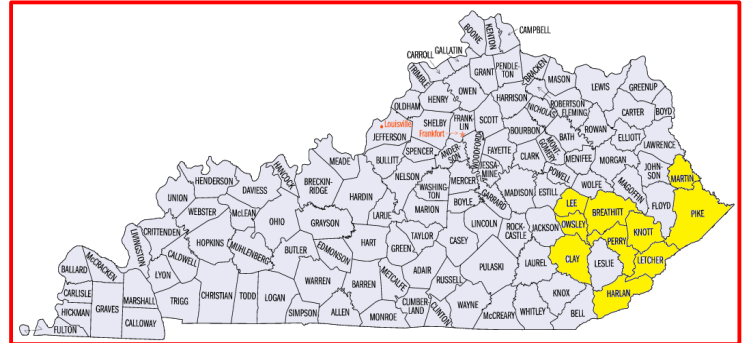

Disaster Declaration Requests Kentucky

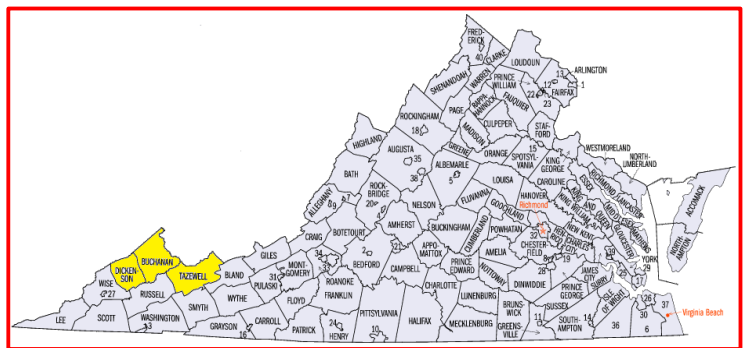
- The death toll from last week's severe weather in Kentucky has risen to 21, Gov. Andy Beshear announced Saturday.
- Kentucky Gov. Andy Beshear described the storm as "one of the most serious weather events" the state has seen in a decade.
- The rain broke daily rainfall records in the Kentucky cities of Frankford, Paducah, Bowling Green, London, and Jackson.
- The city of Hazard in Perry County, Kentucky, has seen its worst flooding in 40 years. The North Fork Kentucky River crested at 30.5 inches overnight, marking the most significant flood in the city since 1984.
- The Eastern Kentucky city of Pikeville was one of the most heavily impacted by the floodwaters, which have closed hundreds of major roads and damaged countless homes and businesses.
- Beshear announced this weekend that Kentucky has received a disaster declaration from the White House and is waiting on approval for direct assistance from the federal government.
- He requested individual and public assistance for 10 counties (Breathitt, Clay, Harlan, Knott, Lee, Letcher, Martin, Owsley, Perry and Pike).
- Approximately 660 residents are still out of power and more than 100 roads are closed across the state. Nearly 600 Kentuckians are also sheltering outside of their homes — in parks, hotels, schools and churches.
- On February 20th, WSP responded to a proposal request for this event. We are waiting for FEMA's decision award.

Virginia

- On February 16, Governor Glenn Youngkin requested an expedited major disaster declaration from President Donald Trump after a weekend storm brought torrential rain and catastrophic flooding to parts of Southwest Virginia.
- The counties included in the request for Individual Assistance are Dickenson, Buchanan and Tazewell.
- Hundreds of roads and bridges are impassable, and homes and businesses have been damaged or destroyed, with the worst damage appearing to be in Buchanan, Dickenson and Tazewell counties, all of which remain under local states of emergency. Some areas saw 7 inches of rain fall over the weekend.

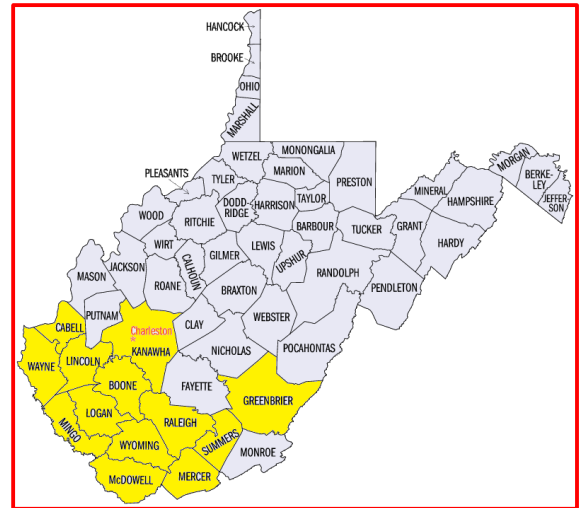
WSP USA INSPECTION SERVICES DISASTER AWARENESS REPORT

February 24, 2025

- The towns of Grundy and Hurley in Buchanan County have experienced catastrophic flooding, with the river gauges in these towns spiking historical flood levels.
- FEMA is currently performing preliminary damage assessments in seven counties.
- Governor Youngkin declared a state of emergency on February 10, 2025.
- On February 20th, WSP responded to a proposal request for this event. We are waiting for FEMA’s decision award.

West Virginia

- On February 17, Governor Patrick Morrisey formally requested a Major Disaster Declaration for the state of West Virginia.
- Governor Morrisey has requested activation of the Individual Assistance (IA) Program and the Public Assistance (PA) Program in counties hardest hit by recent severe weather and flooding, which includes Boone, Cabell, Greenbrier, Kanawha, Lincoln, Logan, Mercer, McDowell, Mingo, Raleigh, Summers, Wayne, and Wyoming Counties.
- FEMA is currently conducting damage assessments in West Virginia before making a final determination on federal assistance, according to sources.
- Counties in the southern part of West Virginia are pushing mud and water out of their homes and businesses after between 3 and 5 inches of rain poured down on a 13-county region between Feb. 14 through Feb. 16.
- “This is the worst flood in the recorded history of McDowell County,” said McDowell County Emergency Management Director Bobby Bowman.
- On February 15, Governor Patrick Morrisey declared a state of emergency for ten counties, which included Cabell, Greenbrier, Kanawha, Logan, Mercer, McDowell, Mingo, Raleigh, Summers, and Wyoming.
- On February 20th, WSP responded to a proposal request for this event. We are waiting for FEMA’s decision award.
