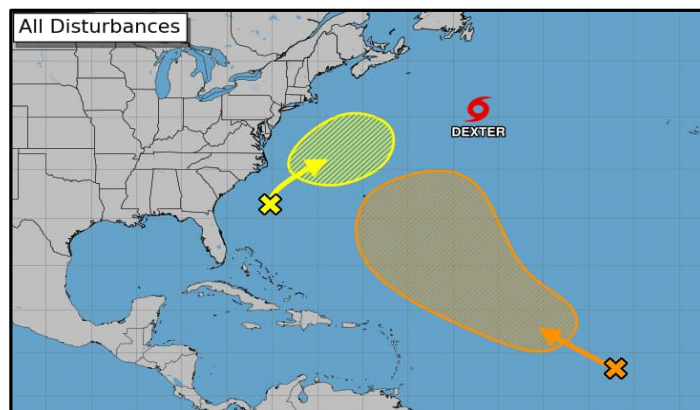

August 7, 2025

Tropical Activity

Atlantic - Disturbance #1

- Located a couple of hundred miles off the coast of the southeastern United States.
- Producing minimal shower and thunder-storm activity.
- Some slow tropical or subtropical development is possible over the weekend while the system moves northward to northeastward.
- By early next week, the low is expected to become extratropical, ending its chances for tropical development.
- Formation chance - 48 hour: Low (0%); 7-day: Low (30%)



Atlantic - Disturbance #2

- A tropical wave over the central tropical Atlantic is producing disorganized shower activity.
- Forecasted to become more conducive for gradual development in a few days, and a tropical depression could form late this weekend or early next week.
- Moving west northwestward to northwestward across the central tropical and subtropical Atlantic.
- Formation chance 48 hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Medium (60%)

Severe Storm Outlook

Northern Plains

- A frontal boundary slowly pushing through the northern tier of the country will be the focus of severe thunderstorms over the next couple of days.
- Thunderstorms capable of producing tornadoes, hurricane-force wind gusts and very large hail.
- NOAA's Storm Prediction Center has placed parts of North Dakota, including Bismarck and Fargo, under the greatest risk for severe storms on Thursday.
- The most intense storm activity is forecast to develop during the late-afternoon and evening hours.
- Forecasters warn that some of these storms could evolve into a mesoscale convective system (MCS), which could take the form of a squall line or even a derecho.
- The SPC, in coordination with local National Weather Service offices, are expected to issue either Severe Thunderstorm Watches or Tornado Watches in advance of the event.
