Severe Weather Outlook

- A large multifaceted storm is brewing for the nation's midsection once again.
- The latest projections from Accuweather's team of forecasters indicate another round of severe weather is likely for parts of the Plains and Midwest, while the colder side of the storm could generate the third snowstorm in 10 days for parts of Montana and the Dakotas.
- April has been a busy month not only in terms of severe thunderstorms but wintry conditions as well.



- An outbreak of severe thunderstorms, including at least 55 confirmed tornadoes, tore through areas from Texas to Minnesota to Kentucky last week. That included the Salado, Texas, EF3 tornado and the Taopi, Minnesota, EF2 tornado.
- While that happened, a crippling blizzard named Winter Storm Silas by The Weather Channel hammered parts of the northern Rockies and northern Plains with feet of snow and high winds.
- This incoming late-week storm for the Central states was located over the northern Pacific near Alaska's Aleutian Islands as of Monday and is expected to roll into the Northwest later Wednesday, according to AccuWeather Chief On-Air Meteorologist Bernie Rayno.
- While there may be isolated severe thunderstorms in parts of the Plains starting Tuesday, severe thunderstorms could become more numerous and widespread in the Plains beginning Friday.
- The most likely area for severe weather Friday stretches from parts of Kansas northward into Nebraska, western Iowa and southern South Dakota.
- Beyond that, at least some scattered severe storms are possible into the weekend in the central U.S. from parts of the Mississippi Valley into the southern Plains but given differences in forecast model timing of this spring storm, the exact location of that weekend threat is uncertain.
- It's too soon to determine the magnitude of the severe weather threat, but at least some tornadoes, damaging winds, large hail and locally flooding rain are possible in these areas.
