Declaration Request Oklahoma

- Gov. Kevin Stitt announced Tuesday he has asked the White House for additional federal aid for all 77 Oklahoma counties related to the historic winter storms.
- "The severe winter storms caused widespread damage and cost local communities millions of dollars," said Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security Director Mark Gower.
- The request seeks aid for homeowners, renters, business owners and government entities impacted by the winter storm from Feb. 8-20, according to the governor's office.
- If approved, officials said the designation would deliver relief for Oklahomans who have had storm-related damage to their homes or businesses through FEMA's Individual Assistance program as well as additional support for cities, counties, and tribes with infrastructure damages and eligible response costs through FEMA's Public Assistance program.
- Stitt declared a state of emergency in Oklahoma on Feb. 12.
