Tropical Activity Hurricane Danielle (CAT 1)

- Located 690 miles NW of the Azores moving NE at 14 mph; maximum sustained winds 80 mph
- Hurricane-force winds extend up to 35 miles
- Tropical-storm force winds extend 175 miles

Hurricane Earl (CAT 1)

- Located 485 miles S of Bermuda moving N at 6 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- Forecast to become a major hurricane late Thursday or Thursday night
- Hurricane force winds extend 40 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend 125 miles



- Located several hundred miles W of Cabo Verde Islands
- Tropical depression could form in the next day or two
- Moving WNW at 15-20 mph
- Formation chance 48-hour: Medium (60%); 5-day: Medium (60%)


Disturbance 2

- Located near the west African coast
- Forecast to emerge offshore into the eastern Atlantic in the next day or two
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5-day: Low (30%)

2022 Atlantic Hurricane Season Outlook (AccuWeather's Update)

- AccuWeather meteorologists issued an update to the seasonal forecast on Sept. 2, predicting
 what they expect to take place over the nearly three months remaining until hurricane season
 officially winds down on Nov. 30.
- They are forecasting a total of 12 to 16 named tropical systems in the Atlantic hurricane basin
 when the final tally is in this season, including five to seven hurricanes, two or three of which
 may strengthen into major hurricanes (Category 3 strength with winds of 111 mph or higher)
 and three or four direct impacts to the United States.







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
Flood Activity Georgia

- Governor Brian Kemp will be traveling to North Georgia on Wednesday to tour the damage left behind by weekend floods.
- On Sunday, Kemp declared a state of emergency for Floyd and Chattooga counties after heavy rains dumped a massive amount of water in parts of those counties.
- Kemp will reportedly travel to Summerville on Wednesday, which appears to be the hardest hit area from the floods.





- City water should be restored at the end of the week, Janice Galloway, Summerville city manager, said in a phone interview. That could be Friday or even Sunday, but she said she'll know more when a contractor visits the city's water treatment plant Wednesday.
- There were about 30 people working at the plant Tuesday afternoon to restore service to its 11,000 customers, Galloway said.
