Severe Weather Activity

Tennessee

- The National Weather Service was busy Thursday and Friday conducting storm surveys of some of the damaged areas of Middle Tennessee.
- So far, they have confirmed 6 tornadoes from the May 8th-9th storms.
- Several days after an EF-3 tornado ripped through Maury County, officials announced nearly 250 homes sustained damage from the storms.
- More than 22 million people in eight states had been under a tornado watch Wednesday evening in portions of eight states: Oklahoma, Kansas, Arkansas, Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, and Tennessee.



Severe Weather Outlook

- Millions of people across the South are bracing for another potent storm system that's expected to bring more flooding rain and severe weather to areas that have already seen their fair share of extreme weather over the past few weeks.
- The FOX Forecast Center said the overall severe weather threat this week looks to be lower than the most recent deadly severe weather and tornado outbreaks.
- A chance of strong to severe thunderstorms developing this week as the system pushes off to the east from the southern Plains to the Carolinas.
- Flooding will also be an issue as torrential rain falls across areas that are already extremely saturated and have experienced flooding recently.
- The biggest threat is for communities north of Houston, including Waco, Athens, Conroe and Lufkin.
- The FOX Forecast Center said Texas is leading the way for flash flood reports so far in 2024 and will likely keep adding to that total this week.
- Several major cities in Texas are included in that threat zone, like San Antonio, Austin, Waco, Houston and Corpus Christi.
- Shreveport and New Orleans in Louisiana will also be under the threat as the entire state is included in the Level 2 risk.
- Portions of western Mississippi and southern Arkansas have also been included.

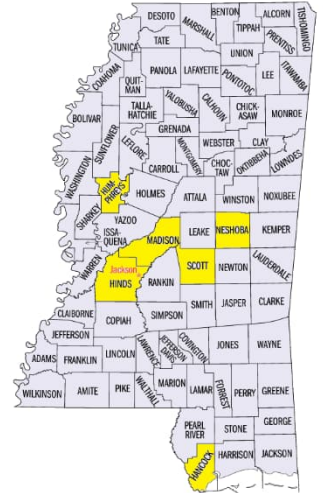

Declaration Request

Mississippi

- Governor Tate Reeves announced on May 10th that he is requesting Individual Assistance from FEMA for six counties impacted by the severe storms, flooding, straight-line winds, and tornadoes from April 8 – April 11, 2024
- During that timeframe, the state experienced 13 tornadoes, and sadly, two people lost their lives.
- Individual assistance is being requested for the counties of Hancock, Hinds, Humphreys, Madison, Neshoba, and Scott.
- FEMA-validated numbers show the number of homes destroyed or with major damage:
 - Hancock County: 35 homes
 - Hinds County: 44 homes
 - Humphreys County: 41 homes
 - Madison County: 31 homes
 - Neshoba County: 21 homes
 - Scott County: 32 homes
