

Tropical Activity

Atlantic – Disturbance 1

- Expected to move off the west African coast later today moving W to WNW at 15 mph.
- A tropical depression could form by late Sunday or early next week.
- Formation chance 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance 5 days: Medium (50%)



Atlantic – Disturbance 2

- Located over the central tropical Atlantic moving WNW at 10-15 mph.
- Conditions are expected to be marginally conducive for some slow development east of the Lesser Antilles by early next week.
- Formation chance 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance 5 days: Low (20%)

Wildfire Activity

California – Dixie Fire

- The Dixie wildfire destroyed large parts of the town of Greenville on Wednesday, tearing through the mountain community in Northern California.
- The blaze, the largest active wildfire in California and second largest in the U.S., has so far destroyed 278,227 acres of land and is only 35 percent contained, according to Cal Fire.
- After growing to more than 434 square miles, the Dixie Fire is now bigger than Dallas and New York City.
- On Wednesday evening, the fire reached Greenville, a small town in Plumas County, destroying several business premises and homes. No injuries or deaths have been reported.
- Evacuation orders for around 15,000 people were issued in areas affected by the Dixie Fire on Wednesday, but officials managed to save several homes throughout the day.
- The Dixie Fire has been raging in the area since July 14 and has destroyed at least 45 homes.

Flood Activity

Kentucky

- Gov. Andy Beshear has issued a state of emergency for Nicholas County after a severe storm damaged homes and other properties in the area. The governor also sent a letter Tuesday to President Joe Biden requesting that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) assesses the damage in the county.
- Gov. Beshear and Lt. Gov. Jaqueline Coleman joined state and county leaders to visit the county on Tuesday afternoon. They got a closer look at the damage left behind by the storms.
- State officials say the county received more than 4 inches of rain, which caused major flash flooding in downtown Carlisle and along Brushy Fork Creek, causing multiple roads to close and streets to flood. One resident died of drowning.
- Approximately 80 homes and 30 businesses have been destroyed by flooding.
- County and city officials currently are performing damage assessments. Once complete, the FEMA will then be asked to perform a Joint Damage Assessment for Public and Individual Assistance.
