Flood Activity

Florida

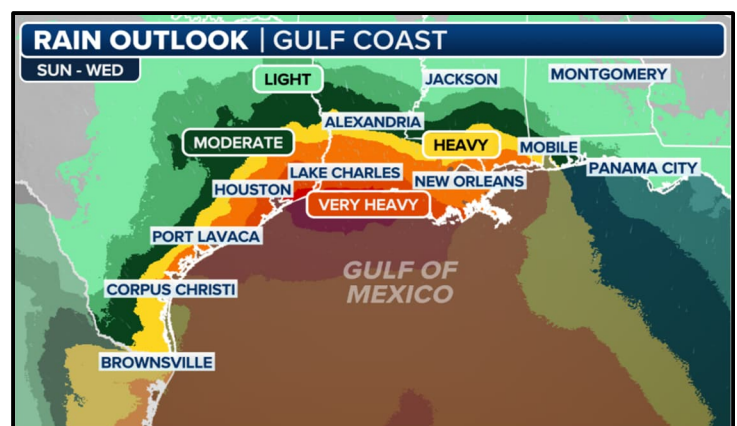
- A state of emergency remains in effect for five counties across South Florida on Thursday after severe flooding swamped the region on Wednesday.
- Invest 90L unleashed more than 2 feet of rain in just two days. The tropical disturbance has now moved offshore of Florida.
- A general 3-8 inches of rain has already fallen across Southwest and South Florida, while areas along Interstate 75 in the Everglades and Interstate 95 in the Miami metro area have picked up an incredible 15-25 inches of rain already.
- Another dangerous day lies ahead Thursday for the Miami metro with more heavy rain anticipated.
- Fort Myers broke a 40-year-old record with nearly 4 inches of rain falling in 24 hours, while Sarasota saw a record 3.93 inches in one hour on Tuesday.
- Gov. Ron DeSantis declared a state of emergency for Broward, Collier, Lee, Miami-Dade and Sarasota counties due to severe flooding.
- Mayors in both Fort Lauderdale and Miami-Dade County declared local states of emergency to help with cleanup and recovery.
- Multiple inches of additional rain are likely in the coming days, and some spots may still pick up an additional 10-plus inches.



Tropical Activity

Atlantic – Disturbance 2

- The National Hurricane Center (NHC) is monitoring a potential tropical disturbance that could form over the weekend across the southwestern Gulf of Mexico.
- Atmospheric conditions could be favorable for development, allowing for a more organized area of low pressure.
- Although there remains uncertainty, there is a better signal for perhaps a tropical depression or weak tropical storm sometime early next week.
- Regardless of any tropical development, the big picture remains focused on relentless rain as a slug of deep tropical moisture will shift away from Florida and become oriented toward Texas or the northern Gulf Coast.
- This would bring heavy rain and potential flash flooding to the region starting Sunday.
