

Flood Activity

Northern Plains/Upper Mississippi Valley

- At least two people are dead after days of severe storms and catastrophic flooding in the Upper Midwest inundated homes and forced evacuations.
- In Minnesota, a breach occurred on the Rapidan Dam but there is no longer a threat for imminent failure.
- Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz said dozens of homes in the town of Waterville, in Le Sueur County, were flooded up to the second floor.
- Assessment and response efforts are underway as the area has seen significant damage and loss
 of infrastructure and property, authorities said Wednesday. As a result of the partial failure and
 raging waters, the river has swallowed a home, a power substation and power poles, a steel
 shipping container, county equipment and more, said Blue Earth County Administrator Robert
 Meyer.
- Water levels peaked at 29.7 feet and have been holding steady for about 24 hours, Mankato City Manager Susan Arntz said Wednesday. Officials expect the river to recede to about 25.5 feet by Friday.
- In Iowa and South Dakota, heavy rainfall since June 20 has led to ongoing flooding. Rivers are receding at upstream locations in South Dakota and northwestern Iowa but continuing to rise at downstream locations on the Des Moines River (central Iowa) and Mississippi River (Iowa/Illinois border). Streams in the affected area remain at a Moderate to Major flood stage.
- Another round of excessive rainfall may occur in the affected areas of the Central Plains and Upper to Middle Mississippi Valley on Thursday, June 27 and Friday, June 28.

Tropical Activity Atlantic - Invest 95L

- Chances are rising for the formation of the season's second named tropical storm over the weekend or early next week in the western Caribbean.
- If it gets named, it will be called Beryl.
- Tropical development is likely as a disturbance approaches the Caribbean islands late Sunday or Monday.



• However, the FOX Forecast Center said there is considerable uncertainty about where the system will go after that time and how strong it could become.
