

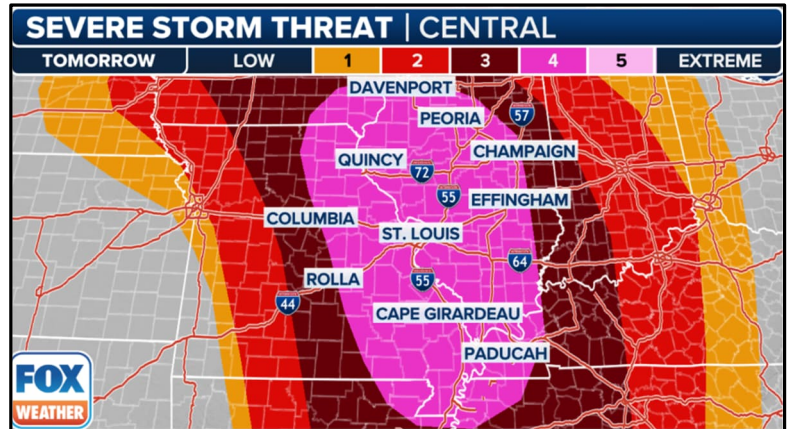

March 13, 2025

## Severe Weather Outlook Central Plains to East Coast

- More than 100 million people in the central and eastern U.S. are being urged to prepare for a potentially dangerous multiday severe weather outbreak.
- Forecasters are most concerned about what is likely to take place Friday and over the weekend.
- Storms that develop on Thursday will be capable of producing some hail and locally damaging wind gusts from portions of eastern Mississippi into Alabama, western Georgia and parts of the Florida Panhandle.
- The FOX Forecast Center said an outbreak of severe weather is likely Friday afternoon and could potentially last into the overnight hours.
- All severe weather hazards are possible, including swaths of potentially destructive wind gusts and strong tornadoes (EF-2 or higher).
- Forecasters said the highest risk for tornadoes stretches more than 750 miles from Iowa to Mississippi, while the overall tornado threat spans over 1,000 miles.
- Nearly 70 million people are at risk of severe weather on Friday.
- Cities like St. Louis in Missouri and Springfield, Decatur and Champaign in Illinois are among the cities in the highest threat zone.
- The storm will move off to the east on Saturday, placing tens of millions of people from the Gulf Coast to the southern Great Lakes at risk of strong to severe thunderstorms.
- Thunderstorms could again produce hail, damaging winds and tornadoes, and torrential rain could lead to some flooding issues.
- "Sunday's severe threat, while expansive, the threat for hail and tornadoes drops and is just a damaging wind threat," the FOX Forecast Center said.
- This includes many major cities, such as Savannah, Georgia; Charleston, South Carolina; Raleigh, North Carolina; Richmond, Virginia; Washington; Baltimore and Philadelphia.
