

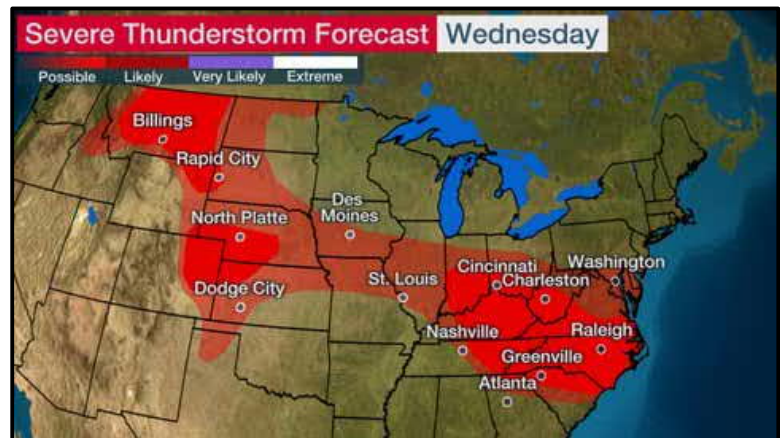

July 6, 2022

Severe Storm Outlook

- Severe storms and flooding rainfall will continue to threaten a broad area that stretches from the Northern Plains to parts of the East during the second half of this week.
- A cluster of severe thunderstorms with widespread destructive winds known as a derecho swept through the Northern Plains on Tuesday, from South Dakota to northeast Nebraska, southwest Minnesota and northern Iowa.
- Wind gusts greater than 90 mph were clocked in South Dakota during yesterday's derecho. The top wind gust was 99 mph in Miner County.
- The forecasts for Thursday are similar, with pockets of severe weather expected in parts of the Northern Plains, Midwest, mid-Atlantic and Southeast on both days.
- Damaging straight-line winds and hail will once again be the primary threats.
- Localized flash flooding will be a concern in many of the same areas at risk for severe weather.



Wildfire Activity

Electra Fire – California

- Evacuation orders were expanded Tuesday for remote California communities near a wildfire that may have been sparked by fireworks or a barbecue on the Fourth of July in a mountainous region that's a top tourism destination.
- The Electra Fire in Sierra Nevada Gold Country broke out Monday afternoon and tripled in size to about 6.1 square miles.
- As of 9 p.m., the wildfire covered 3,900 acres and was 5% contained, according to the Cal Fire Amador-El Dorado Unit.
- Mandatory evacuation orders and warnings combined affected up to 700 residents in Amador County and 300 to 400 people in Calaveras County, Redman said.
