Tropical Activity Atlantic - Hurricane Beryl

- Hurricane Beryl intensified again into a Category 4
 hurricane on Monday morning and remains "extremely
 dangerous" as it closes in on the Windward Islands in
 the Caribbean.
- Beryl is the first hurricane in more than 50 years to appear before July 4th in the Atlantic basin.
- It is expected to unleash potentially catastrophic wind damage and life-threatening storm surge as residents across the region rush to prepare and seek shelter from the monster storm.
- Hurricane Beryl became the second named storm of the 2024 Atlantic hurricane season and made history while the storm rapidly intensified from a tropical depression to tropical storm and then a major hurricane (Category 3 or higher) in less than 48 hours.
- As of the latest advisory from the National Hurricane Center (NHC), Hurricane Beryl was about 70 miles east of Grenada and about 90 miles south-southeast of St. Vincent.
- Hurricane Beryl has maximum sustained winds of 130 mph and a minimum central pressure of 959 millibars, making it a Category 4 on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale.
- Hurricane-force winds (74-plus mph) extend outward up to 35 miles from the center, and tropicalstorm-force winds (39-plus mph) extend outward up to 125 miles.
- On Beryl's forecast trajectory, the storm's center is expected to move across the Windward Islands later Monday morning and then across the southeastern and central Caribbean later Monday through Wednesday.

Atlantic - Tropical Storm Chris

- Tropical Storm Chris formed late Sunday night in the southwestern Gulf of Mexico and made landfall less than two hours later in eastern Mexico.
- Chris then weakened to a tropical depression Monday morning as it moved farther inland.
- According to the National Hurricane Center (NHC), Tropical Storm Chris moved ashore about 11:50 p.m. CT in Mexico's Veracruz state near Lechuguillas, which is about 85 miles southeast of Tuxpan with maximum sustained winds of 40
- mph.The NHC said Chris will likely dissipate over the higher terrain in that region later Monday morning.





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Atlantic - Invest 96L

- Showers and thunderstorms continue in association with an area of low pressure located nearly halfway between Africa and the southeastern Caribbean islands.
- The NHC said a tropical depression is likely to form by the middle of this week.
- Forecasters have given Invest 96L a medium chance of development in the next two days and a high chance in the next week.
- The system is moving westward at 15 to 20 mph and could eventually threaten portions of the Lesser Antilles.
- "On the current schedule, (the system) would impact the eastern Caribbean islands about Wednesday," FOX Weather Hurricane Specialist Bryan Norcross said. "Because the disturbance is still disorganized, the strength of the system at that time is unknowable."
- If Invest 96L becomes a tropical storm, the storm will receive the name Debby.
