

## Soto Fire California

- Firefighters and residents in Southern California are once again under critical fire weather conditions through Wednesday as the Franklin Fire continues to burn.
- On Tuesday night, a new fire erupted in the hills west of Riverside and prompted local evacuations.
- The Soto Fire has burned 30 acres and is 20% contained, according to CAL Fire.
- More than 1.5 million Southern California residents face critical fire weather on Wednesday.
- The Santa Ana winds combined with low relative humidity down to 10% will create several hours of elevated critical fire weather conditions across the region.
- Winds are expected to peak in intensity on Wednesday morning and persist through the day before weakening Wednesday evening.
- This threat once again includes parts of Los Angeles and Ventura counties.
- This area includes Malibu, where the Franklin Fire continues to burn after already consuming more than 4,000 acres.
- The National Weather Service office in Los Angeles has issued Fire Weather and High Wind Warnings for much of Ventura County and western Los Angeles County through Wednesday afternoon.
