

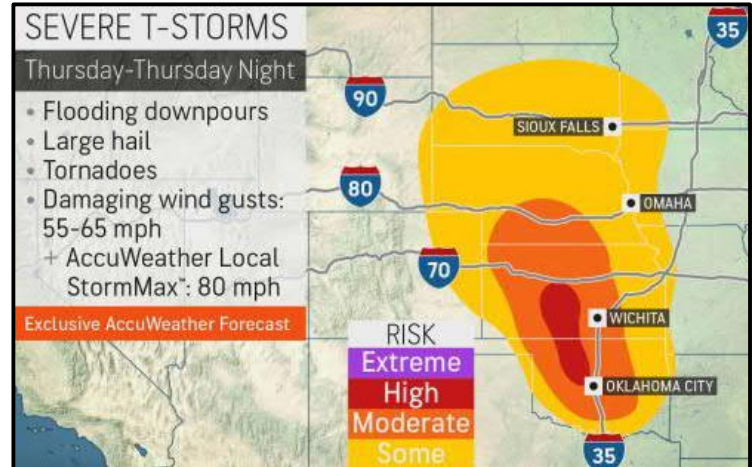

May 11, 2023

## Severe Weather Outlook

- Severe storms in the Plains could produce tornadoes, very large hail and damaging wind gusts Thursday afternoon and evening.
- Scattered showers and thunderstorms are ongoing in the central United States right now. We expect additional storms to erupt and intensify this afternoon and evening across the region.
- On Thursday, the greatest risk of severe storms is from western and central Kansas into central Oklahoma. Tornadoes and very large hail could accompany the more intense storms that form in this region.
- Severe weather is also possible in a broader area that stretches from northwestern Texas to South Dakota. Damaging winds, hail and an isolated tornado are possible threats.
- Some additional severe weather is possible in the Plains on Friday afternoon and evening.
- Large hail and damaging winds could accompany storms that form from central Oklahoma into west-central Texas. Parts of the mid-Missouri Valley could also see severe weather that produces hail, wind damage and an isolated tornado threat.
