

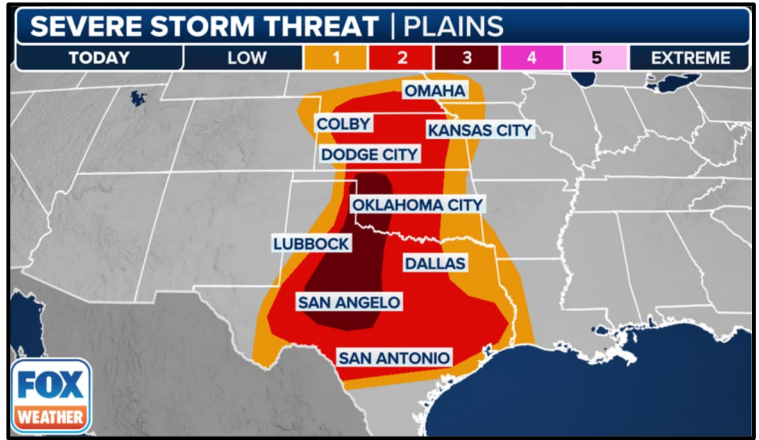

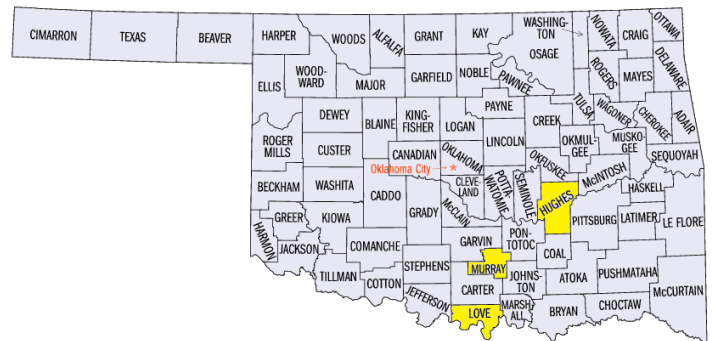
Severe Weather Outlook

- Following another deadly tornado in Kansas on Tuesday, the threat of dangerous storms continues Wednesday, with the worst weather expected from Kansas to Texas.
- A new disturbance will emerge Wednesday from the Rockies, and the Plains will face a potential threat of severe storms.
- It appears the worst of these storms will be west of the devastated areas in Oklahoma.
- Multiple rounds of severe weather are probable, the FOX Forecast Center said with the first developing during the morning along a warm front draped across Kansas.
- "Large hailstones are going to come in, probably West Texas to west Oklahoma. That's where we still have that cold air aloft to really support those larger hailstones," FOX Weather Meteorologist Britta Merwin said.
- Wednesday night will see the storms congeal into a line as they work eastward across Oklahoma and Texas



Disaster Declaration Activity DR-4776 Oklahoma

- President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. declared that a major disaster exists in the State of Oklahoma and ordered Federal aid to supplement State, tribal, and local recovery efforts in the areas affected by severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes, and flooding beginning on April 25, 2024, and continuing.
- The President's action makes Federal funding available to affected individuals in the counties of Hughes, Love, and Murray.
- Damage assessments are continuing in the areas, and more counties and additional forms of assistance may be designated after the surveys are complete.
- Preliminary damage estimates from Saturday's deadly tornado in Sulphur are upwards of \$6.9 million.
- Gov. Kevin Stitt issued an executive order declaring a state of emergency in Carter, Cotton, Garfield, Hughes, Kay, Lincoln, Love, Murray, Okfuskee, Oklahoma, Payne and Pontotoc counties.
- Oklahoma experienced some of the worst impacts from multiple tornadoes on April 27 with as many as 17 tornadoes were reported during the outbreak.
