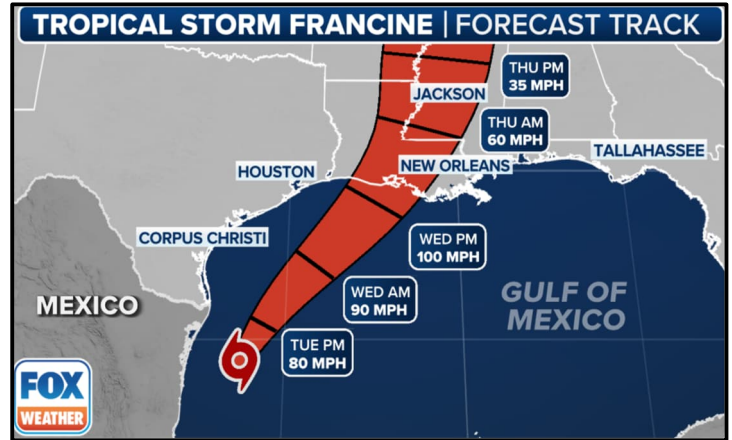

## Tropical Activity

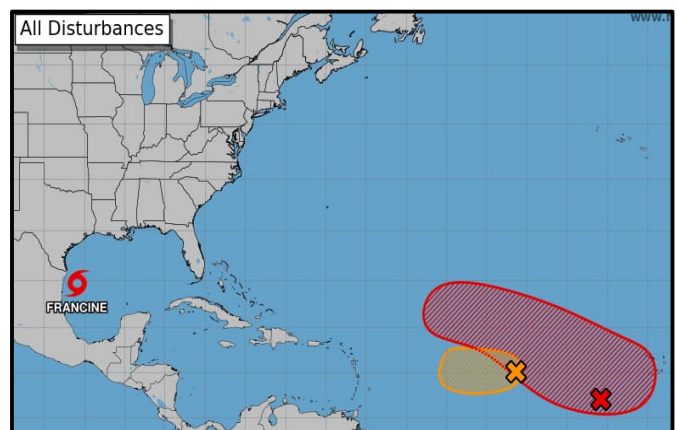
### Atlantic – Potential Tropical Cyclone Six

- Tropical Storm Francine, which developed in the Gulf of Mexico Monday, is expected to strengthen into a hurricane Tuesday and make landfall Wednesday over Louisiana, the National Hurricane Center says.
- "Francine is anticipated to be just offshore of the coasts of northeastern Mexico and southern Texas through today," the center said early Tuesday, "and make landfall in Louisiana on Wednesday. Francine will likely become a hurricane today, with significant strengthening expected before it reaches the coast."
- As of 8 a.m. EDT Tuesday, Francine's center was about 125 miles southeast of the mouth of the Rio Grande and approximately 415 miles south-southwest of Cameron, Louisiana and moving north ever-so-slowly at 5 mph.
- Louisiana Gov. Jeff Landry declared a state of emergency on Monday evening ahead of Francine's arrival.
- Voluntary evacuations in place for three counties in Louisiana (Lower Cameron Parish, Calcasieu Parish, and Jefferson Parish).
- Hurricane warning was in effect Tuesday morning for the Louisiana coast from Sabine Pass to Morgan City.
- A hurricane watch was posted for the Louisiana coast from Morgan City eastward to Grand Isle.
- Francine was expected to dump 4 to 8 inches of rain in many areas and up to a foot in some places, forecasters said, and tropical-storm-force winds were extending outward up to 140 miles from its center.



### Atlantic – Disturbance 1

- An elongated area of low pressure located over the central tropical Atlantic continues to produce some disorganized shower and thunderstorm activity.
- Environmental conditions appear only marginally conducive for some slight development during the next couple of days, but a tropical depression could still form during that time while the system moves westward at 5 to 10 mph over the central tropical Atlantic.
- Formation chance through 48 hours – Medium (40%); 7 days – Medium (40%)



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## Atlantic - Disturbance 2

- A trough of low pressure located several hundred miles southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands is expected to interact and merge with a strong tropical wave located between the west coast of Africa and the Cabo Verde Islands over the next couple of days.
- Thereafter, Environmental conditions appear favorable for gradual development of this combined system, and a tropical depression will likely form during the latter part of this week while the system moves west-northwestward at 10 to 15 mph.
- Formation chance through 48 hours – Low (near 30%); 7 days – High (70%)
