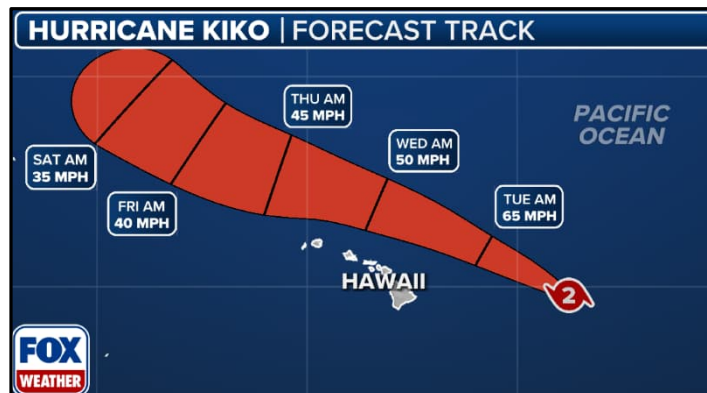

September 8, 2025

Tropical Activity

Central Pacific – Hurricane Kiko (CAT 2)

- Kiko is now a powerful Category 2 storm with maximum sustained winds of 100 mph.
- Kiko is expected to weaken to a tropical storm by late Monday.
- Located less than 500 miles to the east of Hilo, Hawaii, and about 675 miles to the east of Honolulu.
- Currently moving off to the northwest at 14 mph and should continue with that motion over the next few days.
- Kiko is forecast to pass north of the Hawaiian Islands on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Swells generated by Kiko are expected to gradually build and are forecast to peak along east-facing exposures of the Hawaiian Islands late Monday through midweek, potentially producing life-threatening surf and rip currents.



Atlantic

- There is no sign of any significant tropical activity spinning up in the Atlantic in the next week to 10 days. Some tropical disturbances are forecast to move off Africa, but there's no indication that they will take a threatening track.
- Wednesday is the "peak" of the hurricane season – the date when, historically speaking, we are most likely to have a named storm in the Atlantic, the Caribbean or the Gulf.
- AccuWeather said that as of Sunday afternoon, dry air and wind shear were limiting tropical development.
- In its two-week forecast for Sept. 3-16, Colorado State University forecasters are predicting activity will pick up over the next couple of weeks.
- "Global model ensembles are pretty aggressive with additional tropical cyclone development in days 8 through 14, with potential formations in the eastern Atlantic as well as in the western Caribbean/southern Gulf," the CSU forecast said.
- "The primary threat formation area for major hurricanes in early- to mid-September is in the eastern and central tropical Atlantic."
