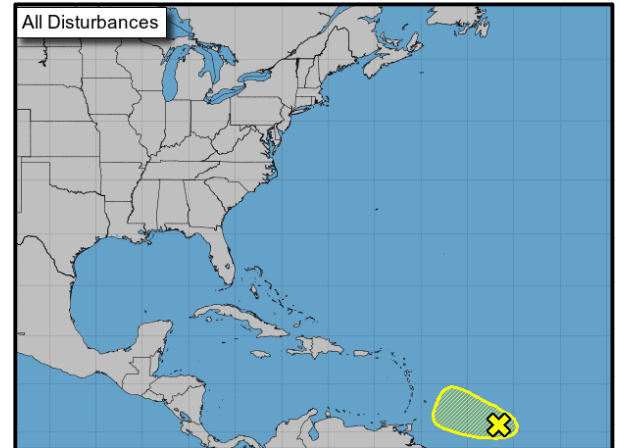

Tropical Activity

Atlantic – Disturbance 1

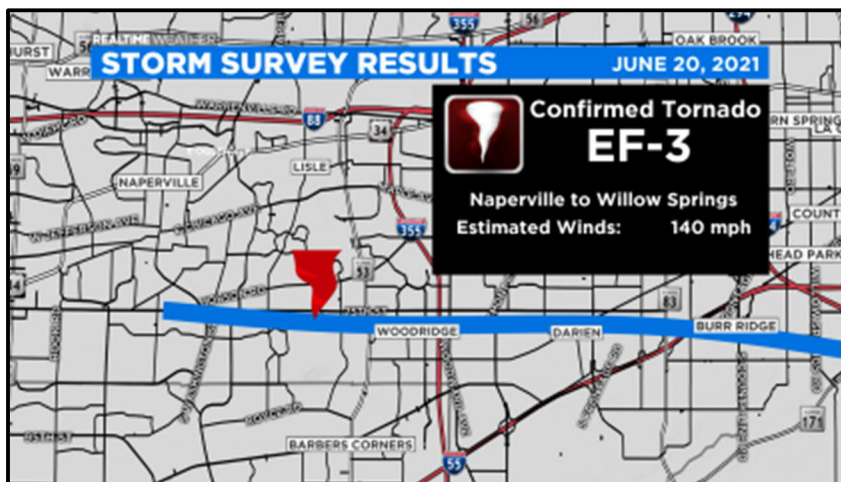
- Showers and thunderstorms have increased in coverage associated with the tropical wave located more than 500 miles east of the Windward Islands.
- Some additional development of this disturbance is possible over the next couple of days.
- This system is expected to move W to WNW at 15-20 mph.
- 48-hour formation chance: Low (30%)
- 5-day formation chance: Low (30%)



Tornado Activity

Illinois

- A confirmed tornado touched down late Sunday evening in Chicago's southwestern suburbs, damaging homes and injuring several people.
- The hardest hit areas were Naperville and Woodridge, Illinois. The City of Naperville's Transportation, Engineering and Development Business Group deemed sixteen homes uninhabitable after the storm.
- The city had received 125 reports of property damage as of early Monday morning.
- Five people in Naperville were hospitalized and one person was reported to have critical injuries.
- At least 75 structures were damaged in Woodridge, just east of Naperville, but no significant injuries were reported in the town.
- About 300 customers remain without power.

Tropical Storm Claudette

- Tropical Storm Claudette has dissipated in the Atlantic Ocean.

Louisiana

- Clean up continues in Slidell after Tropical Storm Claudette dumped rain onto streets and into homes.
- The City of Slidell received about 10-to-12 inches of rain overnight Friday.
- Slidell Mayor Greg Cromer said this is the most extensive flooding he's seen in Slidell since Katrina, with hundreds of properties damaged.
- Louisiana Insurance Commissioner Jim Donelon said about 25% of Louisiana residents have flood insurance.



Alabama

- The National Weather Service in Mobile has confirmed that a second tornado was spawned by Tropical Storm Claudette as it tracked across Alabama on Saturday.
- A storm survey team found damage consistent with an EF-0 tornado in Covington County, the weather service said.
- In Escambia County, at least 50 homes were badly damaged or destroyed, according to the Alabama Emergency Management Agency.
- The twister, rated an EF2 by the NWS, injured 15 to 20 people, two seriously, in the towns of Brewton and East Brewton, Alabama News reported. Peak winds reached up to 127 mph.
- Multiple areas in the state broke daily rainfall records, according to the NWS, including Anniston, Birmingham and Mobile. Mobile's Friday total of 3.81 inches broke its record by nearly an entire inch, a mark that had stood since 1920.
- The storm left its rainiest mark on DeKalb County, where one area recorded 9.83 inches of rain. Overnight rescues were required in parts of southern Alabama and the Florida Panhandle.
- Alabama Power Company crews are still working to repair isolated outages following the severe weather. As of Monday, at 10:30 p.m., Alabama Power reports that they are still dealing with 74 active outages affecting just 1,284 customers.
- Alabama Gov. Kay Ivey declared a state of emergency in eight counties on Monday due to storm damage from flooding, high winds and tornadoes. The counties include Baldwin, Butler, Cherokee, DeKalb, Escambia, Mobile, Monroe and Tuscaloosa.
