Severe Storms South

- Portions of Texas and the northern Gulf Coast are on alert for the potential for severe weather this week.
- The FOX Forecast Center said that as the slow-moving storm system continues to slide off to the east.



- Strong to severe thunderstorms to fire up across Central Texas starting Wednesday night.
- Overall severe weather threat will be on the lower side Wednesday night due to limited atmospheric energy.
- The strongest storms could produce some small hail and strong wind gusts as they slide across
 the densely populated Interstate 35 corridor. The line of severe storms will then continue to
 slide off to the east on Thursday.
- Regions at risk are the same parts of Texas and Louisiana.
- Damaging wind gusts and hail remain the same threats, but some tornadoes are also possible.
