

## Tropical Activity Atlantic – Disturbance 1

- Located 400 miles SSE of Bermuda moving N at 5 mph
- Marginally conducive for some slow development during the next few days
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (20%)

## Atlantic - Remnants of Cindy

- Located 400 miles SSW of Bermuda
- Expected to drift WNW during the next couple of days; Redevelopment is not expected.
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (near 0%)



## Severe Weather Outlook

- AccuWeather meteorologists are monitoring the potential for a high-powered, long-tracking and fast-moving batch of thunderstorms, known as a derecho, to develop later this week across parts of the central United States.
- The first storms are likely to erupt Thursday afternoon, and there are two zones where a derecho may develop, AccuWeather forecasters say.

- "Data suggests that much of Nebraska, northern Kansas, northwestern Missouri and southwestern Iowa will be one area at greatest risk for severe thunderstorms during Thursday afternoon and evening," AccuWeather Senior Meteorologist Dan Pydynowski said.
- From this zone, should an intense complex of storms evolve, it may continue to roll through the late-night hours Thursday and then across the middle portion of the Mississippi Valley and then perhaps into portions of the Ohio or Tennessee valleys Friday.
- At roughly the same time Thursday afternoon, thunderstorms will erupt and may try to organize into one or more complexes in portions of Illinois, Indiana, western Ohio and Kentucky.
- Because there are multiple areas where
   thunderstorms could merge into dangerous and far-reaching complexes, it is possible that some places could be hit by two rounds of dangerous thunderstorms in 12 hours.
