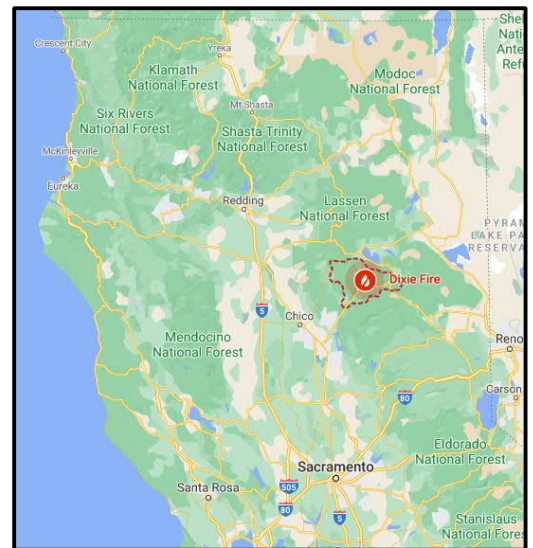
Severe Storms & Tornado Activity Northeast

- An outbreak of severe weather barreled across the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic on Thursday, bringing large hail, damaging straight-line winds and several tornadoes and waterspouts.
- The National Weather Service received more than 100 reports of severe weather between the Ohio Valley and the East Coast.
- Early Thursday evening, multiple damaging tornadoes tore through parts of eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey.
- At least one tornado, possibly more, tracked through Bucks County, Pennsylvania, damaging structures in Buckingham Township, before crossing into the Trenton, New Jersey, metro area.
- Tornadoes then took aim on southern New Jersey.
- Thursday may have tied or topped New Jersey's record number of tornadoes in any outbreak set on Nov. 16, 1989, when seven tornadoes were documented, according to meteorologist Bob Henson.



Wildfire Activity California – Dixie Fire

- As firefighters continue to increase containment lines around California's largest wildfire, some evacuation orders are being lifted and some roads are beginning to reopen in Butte and Plumas counties.
- As of Sunday evening, the Dixie Fire had burned 248,570 acres and was 33% contained, according to Cal Fire.
- More than 10,400 structures are threatened by the blaze, and 67 structures have been destroyed, according to Cal Fire. It's now the 11th largest fire in California history.
- The Dixie Fire had already leveled more than a dozen houses and other structures in Northern California when it combined with the Fly Fire and tore through the tiny community of Indian Falls after dark.
- While the West, as a whole, has been overrun with wildfires and smoke, the situation has been particularly challenging in the Northwest.
- As of Monday morning, more than 75 active fires were burning across the northwestern U.S., including the Bootleg Fire in southern Oregon which has already swelled to more than 400,000 acres in size, making it the third largest in Oregon's history.
