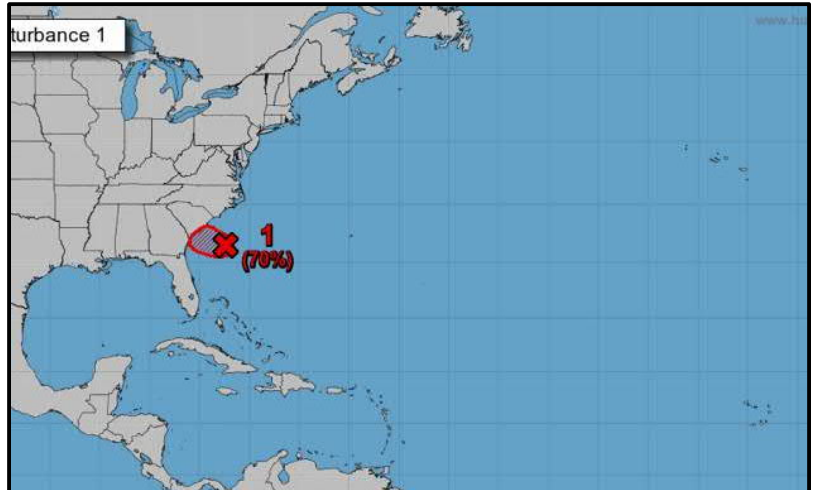

Tropical Activity (Atlantic)

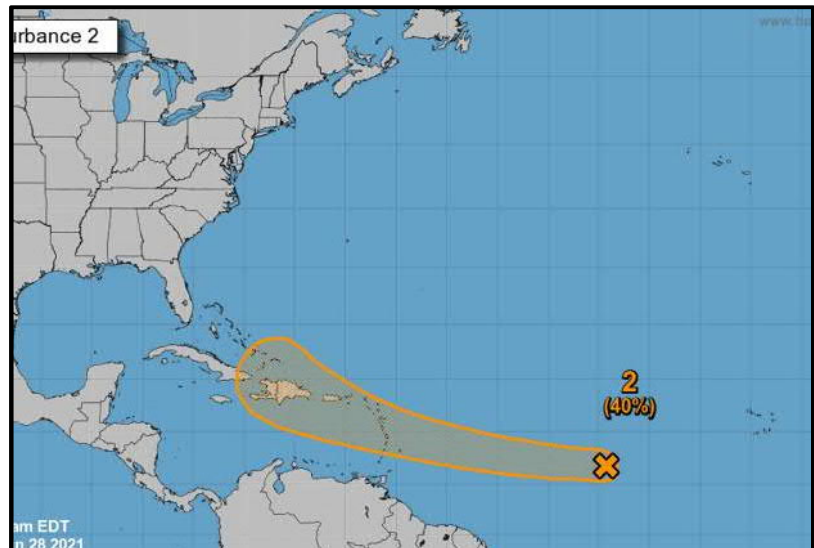
Disturbance 1

- As of 7 a.m., a well-defined low pressure system was about 190 miles southeast of Hilton Head Island, South Carolina, forecasters said.
- It's expected to move northwest at 15 to 20 mph and reach the coasts of South Carolina and Georgia by Monday night.
- The system is producing a large area of showers and thunderstorms, forecasters said, mainly west of the center. If the system organizes any further, forecasters said they will issue tropical depression or tropical storm advisories.
- If the advisories are issued, forecasters said, tropical storm warnings would be required for parts of South Carolina and Georgia with short notice.
- The system has a 70% chance of developing into at least a tropical depression within 48 hours.



Disturbance 2

- A broad area of low pressure associated with a tropical wave is producing a small cluster of showers and thunderstorms over the central tropical Atlantic Ocean. Some slow development is possible through the end of the week while this system moves quickly westward to west-northwestward at about 20 mph, likely reaching the Lesser Antilles Wednesday night.
- Formation chance through 48 hours...low...20 percent.
- Formation chance through 5 days...medium...40 percent

Severe Flooding

Michigan

- Gov. Gretchen Whitmer declared a state of emergency in Wayne County Saturday to help address threats to public health and safety related to heavy rainfall, which resulted in widespread flooding, power outages, flooded roadways, stranded motorists, flooding of homes, and displaced residents.
- Whitmer said help is on the way for residents impacted by the floods, but it's uncertain when that help will come and how much Michigan will have to fund it.
- Whitmer said she's been in touch with Federal Emergency Management Agency and members of Congress, but disaster relief may not come in time as rain is expected to return to Metro Detroit.
- Michigan State Police (MSP) Detroit said flooded metro Detroit freeways were "littered with abandoned vehicles." Hundreds of vehicles were caught in the flooding and dozens of drivers rescued by emergency services. Flood water was so deep police divers were called on to check some vehicles for occupants. As of 27 June no fatalities were reported.
- Detroit Mayor, Mike Duggan, said "Our city has experienced extraordinary rainfall of nearly 6 inches in 24 hours, far beyond the capacity of Southeast Michigan's stormwater system.
- "Early this morning they had at least 700 calls in there with complaints about flooding basements, but I'm sure that number is going to go up," said Dearborn Fire Chief Joseph Murray.



Missouri

- Thunderstorms and heavy rainfall over the weekend 25 to 27 June caused flash flooding across parts of Missouri, USA. Roads were swamped and vehicles stranded.
- Some homes and businesses were damaged, prompting evacuations.
- One person died and two were rescued after a vehicle went into flood waters in Clinton County.
