Severe Weather Outlook

- Residents in part of the Southeast will face another day of volatile weather Wednesday and Wednesday night that will include the risk of tornadoes.
- AccuWeather meteorologists say the risk of flash flooding will also be heightened as a result of the rounds of stormy weather so far this week.
- The most significant threat for tornadoes will extend from central and southern




Georgia and South Carolina to northern Florida and includes southeastern Alabama into Wednesday night.

- The severe weather threat and the potential for a few tornadoes also extends farther to the north and west and includes areas from eastern Tennessee, southeastern Kentucky and part of West Virginia, as well as western Virginia and western and central Georgia.
- The severe weather threat will linger for the entire day and into Wednesday night for locations south of Interstate 20.
- In areas farther to the north in Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina, severe thunderstorms are likely to hold off until after dark and may not move through until the middle of Wednesday night.

Tornado Activity

- Another deadly outbreak of tornadoes and severe storms left a trail of destruction across the South. At least two people have been killed in the storms.
- Multiple tornadoes were seen on the ground in Alabama, Georgia and South Carolina beginning in the early-afternoon hours Tuesday, with perhaps the most damage noted in Allendale County in southwestern South Carolina.
- There was at least 10 to 15 miles of damage in destruction in Allendale County, South Carolina.



- Damage assessments were still ongoing, but early estimates found that 11 houses had been damaged or destroyed.
- Storms rolled through Bryan County, Georgia, Tuesday, with the local Sheriff's Office commenting that the northern part of the county in eastern Georgia was "hard hit."
- The tornado first hit the Bryan County courthouse in downtown Pembroke and then tracked east into nearby neighborhoods and then into the small town of Ellabell. The area is roughly 30 miles west of downtown Savannah.

- In Pembroke, Georgia, a woman was killed Tuesday evening when her mobile home was destroyed by a possible tornado.
- Two confirmed tornadoes already touched down early Tuesday in Texas, including one in Johnson County, near the town of Joshua, where one person died.
- The Storm Prediction Center preliminary tornado reports indicate 54 tornado touchdowns across MS, AL, GA, and SC.
