

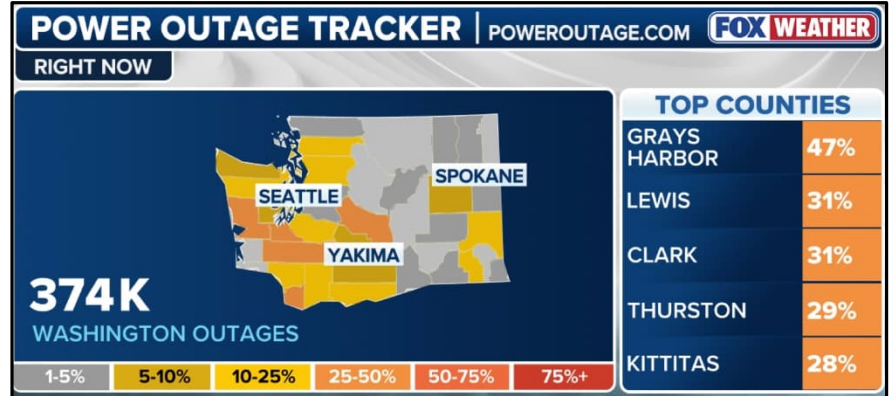

December 17, 2025

Coast to Coast Storm

- A massive coast-to-coast storm is charging across the country, packing hurricane-force wind gusts and will impact more than 30 states by the end of the week.
- Powerful wind gusts compounded the existing power outages caused by the ongoing flooding across Washington early Wednesday.
- A 71 mph wind gust was clocked at Naval Air Station Whidbey Island in the Puget Sound, and a 138 mph gale was recorded on Mount Hood, Oregon.
- Early Wednesday, power outages impacted more than 350,000 customers in Washington and another 200,000 in Oregon.
- The storm will spread mostly heavy rain, strong winds and some snow as it tracks east across the country through the end of the workweek.
- This storm is expected to deliver wind gusts of 50 to 70 mph across much of Montana, as well as parts of Idaho, Wyoming, and the Dakotas on Wednesday.
- The National Weather Service (NWS) issued High Wind Warnings and Wind Advisories across Montana through Wednesday.



Flood Activity

Washington

- Tuesday December 16, Governor Bob Ferguson amended his emergency proclamation to swiftly provide emergency support in response to historic flooding across Washington.
- The amendment adds details about specific impacts across 14 counties, activating state cash and benefits assistance programs to provide emergency support to Washingtonians faster.
- The Emergency Management Division is setting up Disaster Case Management, which will provide long-term assistance to Washingtonians to help them navigate available resources.
- Washington state is actively working with FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, on applying for a Major Disaster Declaration. This declaration will unlock additional federal resources for individuals, governments and nonprofits.
- There have been more than 1,200 rescues and evacuations across more than 10 counties in Washington state since the flooding began.
- As of Tuesday morning, thousands of Washingtonians were under evacuation orders, with more expected over the next 48 hours.

- Flash flood warnings in King County, Washington, around 20 miles east of Seattle, is under flash flood warnings after two levees in the area were breached.
- The first levee, the Desimone Levee in Tukwila, Washington, breached on Monday afternoon, Dec. 15 and the second, located near the Pacific, breached on Tuesday, Dec. 16.
- Approximately 250 National Guard soldiers are still deployed to assist with the emergency response, including helping Washingtonians safely evacuate affected areas.
