

## Flood Activity

## Northeast

- Although the powerful winter storm packing destructive winds and flooding rain in the eastern third of the country is moving into Canada, widespread power outages and significant river flooding are lingering across the Northeast on Wednesday.
- On Wednesday morning, emergency management in New London County, Connecticut, reported the potential failure of the Fitchville Pond Dam along the Yantic River. Authorities have warned of life-threatening flash flooding in areas downstream from the dam, including the town of Fitchville.
- Coastal Flood Warnings and Advisories have been issued by the National Weather Service, with
  the worst of the coastal flooding forecast to occur in and around the Chesapeake and Delaware
  bays. At the coast, another dangerous high-tide cycle will send Atlantic waters onto the land
  during the Wednesday morning high tide.
- The Delaware River in Philadelphia broke an all-time record crest, previously set during Superstorm Sandy, as it rose to 10.66 feet above the low-tide level during high tide at 12:30 a.m. EST Wednesday, according to the National Weather Service.
- Ahead of the storm, New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy declared a state of emergency for all 21 counties in the state. In Maryland, Governor Wes Moore declared a state of preparedness due to the severe weather conditions.
- On Tuesday, New Jersey residents expected the Pompton River in Pompton Plains to rise to about 19 feet by Wednesday morning. The forecast now calls for a crest of over 20 feet on Wednesday evening.

## Severe Weather Activity Southeast

- Storms started the morning on Tuesday over Alabama, knocking over trees and producing at least one suspected tornado.
- The heaviest concentration of damage was near the Florida-Alabama border in Houston County.
- Significant damage was reported in Bay County after at least one tornado tore through the Florida Panhandle.
- According to county officials, at least five local people
  were injured during the storm, while 100 people were displaced, and approximately 1,400
  households were without power.
- NOAA's Storm Prediction Center (SPC) issued a storm report noting a 106-mph wind gust at Ed Walline Beach Access near Santa Rosa Beach, Florida.
- On Tuesday night, Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis said that approximately 87,700 residents reported that they were without electric power.
- Gov. Ron DeSantis declared a state of emergency Tuesday for 49 of Florida's 67 counties, nearly three quarters of the state.
- At one point on Tuesday afternoon, more than 22 million people were under tornado watches
  from Florida to Virginia. Tuesday night, the number of people under tornado watches dropped
  to about 12 million as the threat of severe weather began to diminish in some states such as
  Georgia and South Carolina.
- There were at least 10 reports of tornadoes across the South by Tuesday afternoon, according to the Storm Prediction Center at the National Weather Service, though those remained unconfirmed until emergency officials and the Weather Service could survey the damage.
- The Weather Service said it would send crews to assess damage on Wednesday in Walton, Bay and Jackson counties in Florida. Crews were expected to look at damage on Thursday in Houston, Alabama and Calhoun counties in Georgia.
