

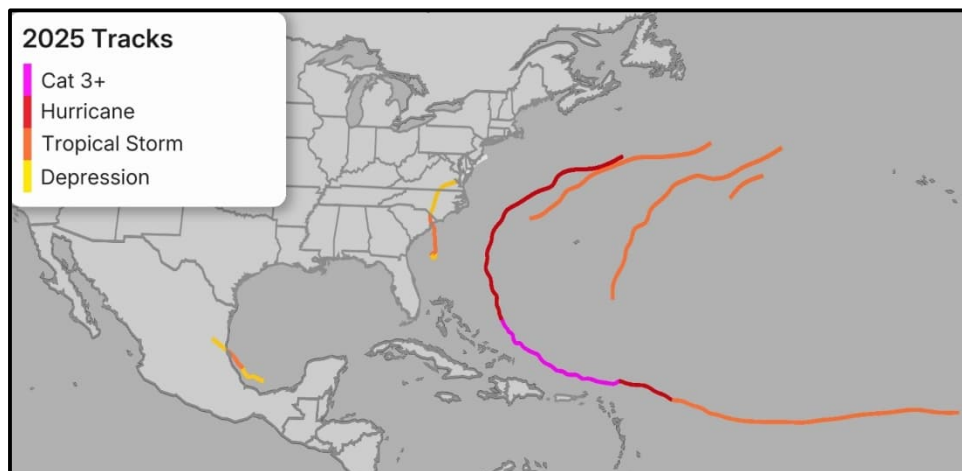
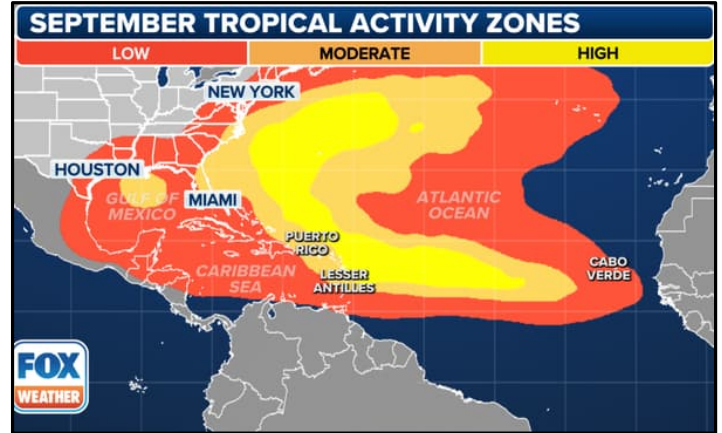

Peak of Atlantic Hurricane Season

- September 10th marks the statistical peak of the Atlantic hurricane season and forecasters aren't tracking any disturbances.
- According to a discussion issued Tuesday by the experts at Colorado State University (CSU), dry air and increased wind shear coupled with sinking air over Africa is likely leading to a quiet stretch of weather in the tropical Atlantic.
- "We do anticipate the season picking up, however, given that large-scale conditions appear to become more tropical cyclone-favorable later in September," CSU experts wrote in the report.
- FOX Weather Hurricane Specialist Bryan Norcross believes that attention in the tropics will turn to the western Caribbean and the southern Gulf in a couple of weeks. That's where fronts that are becoming more frequent as the seasons change die and stir up tropical trouble this time of year.
- One year ago, we were tracking Hurricane Francine approaching the Gulf Coast, a tropical depression that would soon become Gordon, and three other areas.
- It has been 13 days since the last tropical storm, Fernand, and the 2025 hurricane season has now fallen behind the average pace. We're now about two storms and two hurricanes behind the average pace through the week of Sept. 7.
- According to the CSU forecast team, if the Atlantic Basin doesn't generate a tropical storm through Sept. 16, it would be only the second time since 1950 without a named storm between Aug. 29 - Sept. 16. The other year that happened was in 1992.
- The next name on the Atlantic list is Gabrielle, followed by Humberto, Imelda and Jerry.
