## Disaster Declaration Requests Arkansas

- On March 21, Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders requested a Major Disaster Declaration from President Donald J. Trump to support ongoing recovery efforts in communities impacted by the severe storms and tornadoes on March 14, 2025.
- She is specifically requesting individual assistance for Greene, Hot Spring, Independence, Izard, Jackson, Lawrence, Randolph, Sharp, and Stone counties.
- A powerful storm system resulted in a multi-day outbreak of severe storms across Arkansas beginning Friday, March 14, and continuing through Saturday, March 15.

- As of March 17, at least 3 fatalities and 32 injuries had been reported across Arkansas.
- Tornado surveys remain underway, but so far:
  - o 10 of the tornadoes that have been confirmed were rated EF-2 or stronger.
  - o 6 tornadoes had paths of 18 miles or longer.
  - o 3 tornadoes tracked 32, 45, and 81 miles, respectively.
  - The tornado which struck the towns of Cushman and Cave City is one of the longest tracks in state history with a path length of 81 miles and a total time on the ground of 1 hour and 35 minutes.
- This tornado outbreak is the second largest since the tornado outbreak on April 25, 2011, sitting behind the Memorial Day weekend outbreak of 2024. The number of EF-3+ tornadoes in this event is the highest since January 21, 1999.
- Joint local, State, and FEMA Individual Assistance damage assessments began on March 17, 2025, and concluded on March 20, 2025. After ground assessments, a review of geospatial data and open-source data, there have been 456 structures assessed with an average of 72.17% ownership and 66.77% insured:
  - 156 categorized as destroyed
  - 93 categorized as major
  - o 88 categorized as minor
  - o 119 categorized as affected


## Oklahoma

- On March 21, Governor Kevin Stitt requested a Major Disaster Declaration from President Donald J. Trump for individual assistance for seven counties (Cleveland, Creek, Payne, Pawnee, Lincoln, Logan and Oklahoma) due to impacts from dangerous wildfires and straight-line winds that began Friday, March 14<sup>th</sup>.
- On March 17th, Governor Stitt declared a State of Emergency in Cleveland, Creek, Dewey, Grady, Lincoln, Logan, Oklahoma, Pawnee, Payne, Pottawatomie, Roger Mills, and Stephens counties following devastating fires across the state.



## March 24, 2025

- There has been four confirmed fatalities and 200 injuries.
- According to the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management, the latest damage assessments show:
  - 9 homes damaged in Cleveland County
  - o 21 homes damaged in Oklahoma County
  - 35 homes damaged in Lincoln County
  - o 70 homes damaged in Creek County
  - o 114 homes damaged in Logan County
  - o 115 homes damaged in Pawnee County
  - o 173 homes damaged in Payne County
- Officials continue to assess damage and coordinate relief efforts as the state recovers from the fires.
