## Severe Weather & Flood Activity

#### Washington

- Whatcom County residents and government agencies are turning toward recovery after torrential November rains caused two rounds of devastating floods along the Nooksack River.
- Skies cleared Thursday morning, Dec. 2, after a three-week barrage of "atmospheric river" storms triggered widespread flooding Nov. 13-15 and inundated Everson, Nooksack and Sumas for a second time Nov. 27-28.



- All flood watches and warnings were canceled and the threat of landslides was easing, according to the National Weather Service in Seattle.
- In hard-hit Sumas, a total of 316 homes suffered at least some flood damage, Christensen said.
- Damage had been reported to more than 700 homes across Whatcom County through Wednesday, Dec. 1, said Amy Cloud, spokeswoman for the county's Emergency Operations Center.

#### <u>Hawaii</u>

- The entire state is under a flash flood watch through Monday afternoon, and the Big Island summits will be under blizzard and high wind warnings over the weekend with winds gusting over 100 mph, and a possible foot of snow, forecasters said.
- The flood watch is due to a cold front that will move over the islands and then stall as a kona low develops west of Kauai, bringing the threat of an extended period of flooding rain, the National Weather Service said.
- The weather service issued both high wind and blizzard warnings for the Big Island summits from 6 p.m. Friday until 6 a.m. Sunday.



- "Travel could be very difficult to impossible. Blowing snow will significantly reduce visibility at times, with periods of zero visibility," forecasters said.
- They predict southwest winds from 50 to 80 mph with localized gusts over 100 mph.
