Tropical Activity

<u>Atlantic – Disturbance 1</u>

- Located 875 miles west-southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands.
- Tropical depression could form during the next several days.
- Formation chance 48-hour: Medium (40%); 7-day: Medium (60%)

<u>Atlantic – Disturbance 2</u>

- Forecast to move off the coast of Africa early Wednesday.
- Further development possible over the weekend.
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Medium (60%)

Atlantic – Disturbance 3

- Could form in the Gulf of Mexico by the beginning of next week.
- Slow development is possible.
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (30%)


Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Hilary (CAT 1)

- Hurricane Hilary is located about 320 miles to the southwest of Manzanillo, Mexico and about 560 miles to the south-southeast of Cabo San Lucas, Mexico, and is moving to the west-northwest at 13 mph with maximum sustained winds of 75 mph.
- Hilary rapidly intensified into a hurricane on Thursday morning after developing into a tropical storm on Wednesday, and forecasters say that the hurricane's path could bring "significant" impacts to Southern California and the Southwest by the end of the week and into the first part of next week.



- Ocean water off the coast of California is cool, so winds should diminish the intensity of Hurricane Hilary if the forecast track brings the storm to the Golden State.
- What forecasters are keeping an eye on will be the abundant tropical moisture that could be flowing into California, Nevada and Arizona.
- The NHC says Hurricane Hilary is expected to continue to spin off to the west-northwest through Thursday night. A turn to the northwest is expected Friday morning, followed by a turn toward the north-northwest and north on Saturday.
- On this path, the center of Hurricane Hilary will approach the Baja California peninsula over the weekend, according to the NHC.

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
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Eastern Pacific – Tropical Storm Fernanda

- On Sunday, the National Hurricane Center (NHC) upgraded Tropical Storm Fernanda in the Eastern Pacific to Hurricane Fernanda, which quickly became a major hurricane.
- Fernanda then began to weaken on Monday and Tuesday.
- Weakening continued on Wednesday, and Fernanda was downgraded to a tropical storm. The NHC says Tropical Storm



Fernanda has maximum sustained winds of 40 mph and is moving to the west at 15 mph.

• According to the NHC, the tropical storm will likely become a post-tropical remnant low on Thursday and dissipate over the weekend.
