

February 3, 2021

Winter Storm Northeast

- After a three-day snowstorm, a heavy blanket of record-breaking, deadly snowfall has left an entire winter's worth of snow behind.
- As the bull's-eye of the storm targeted the mid-Atlantic and moved into the Northeast, the multiple feet of snow that accumulated in many areas got all the headlines.



- The most heavily concentrated center of that bull's-eye ended up being over the regions of eastern Pennsylvania, northern New Jersey and the Greater New York City area, as many places recorded snow accumulations north of 30 inches.
- More than 36 inches of snow was reported in Nazareth, Pennsylvania, according to a National Weather Service list of storm reports.
- Farther east, the storm also coated much of New York, Massachusetts and Connecticut, spurring hundreds of snow removal vehicles into action and leaving thousands of residents temporarily without power.
- While in-land communities saw as much as 2 feet of snow with the nor'easter, communities along the coast faced destructive surf, flooding and erosion.
- High tides led to coastal flooding in several beach towns, with waves crashing over seawalls and flooding low-lying areas overnight.
- On Cape Cod, erosion left several homes along Salt Marsh Road in Sandwich so heavily damaged, they have been condemned, including one that's foundation appeared to collapse after the ground beneath it was washed away.
