Severe Weather Outlook


- Multiple rounds of severe weather that will carry the risk of tornadoes are in the forecast for the storm-weary southern United States, AccuWeather meteorologists warn.
- As the threat of severe weather shifts eastward along the interstate 10 and 20 corridors, at least 30 million people will be at risk on a daily basis through Wednesday.



- On Tuesday, the risk of isolated tornadoes may be greatest from southeastern Alabama to southern Georgia and the southern part of South Carolina.
- Downpours may linger for a time in the wake of the line of storms on Tuesday, which can continue the risk of urban and small stream flooding.
- Areas from southeastern Louisiana and Mississippi to much of Alabama, Georgia and South Carolina, as well as northern Florida, will be in the path of the severe thunderstorm complex.
- Storms that erupted Monday evening carried an elevated risk of large hail and high winds from north-central Texas to southern Oklahoma.
- By early Tuesday morning, roughly 43,000 residents were without power across northeast Texas, with almost half of the outages accounted for by Smith County.

Tornado Activity (March 29-31, 2022)

- Tornado activity in March surged into record territory across the US. From the beginning of the month through the end, there was hardly a break in the severe weather.
- When the final tally is in, March 2022 very well could set a record for the most tornadoes ever in the month of March across the U.S. since record-keeping began.



- At least 253 preliminary tornado reports were recorded throughout March 2022, according to the latest count from the Storm Prediction Center.
- While the number is preliminary, only 193 of the reports need to be confirmed as actual tornadoes to break the record of 192 confirmed tornadoes in 2017, according to the National Climatic Data Center. Records date back to 1950, though the numbers for 2020 through 2022 are preliminary.

Arkansas

- Springdale Mayor Doug Sprouse met with county and state emergency management services Monday. That meeting will better determine if the city can access federal funds through FEMA to help tornado victims recover.
- If that happens, federal dollars will be made available to help replace homes and destroyed belongings along with reimbursement for temporary living expenses.
- Mayor Sprouse said he's confident they've been gathering the property damage estimates accurately in hopes of accessing those funds.
- Colby Fulfer, the city's chief of staff, reported Friday that the city's unofficial estimates note 400 homes and 25 businesses received some form of damage -- probably 100 severely.

Mississippi

- At least 21 tornadoes have been confirmed by the National Weather Service to have occurred on March 30.
- The Mississippi Emergency Management Agency said continues to work with counties to assess damage from the severe weather from that day.
- So far, six injuries have been reported to MEMA Two in Noxubee County and one each in Bolivar, Holmes, Lafayette and Panola counties.
- More than 530 homes, 40 businesses and 40 farms across the state were reported to have some sort of damage from the storm systems that rolled across the state.
- Thirty-one counties have reported some sort of damage in their area.
