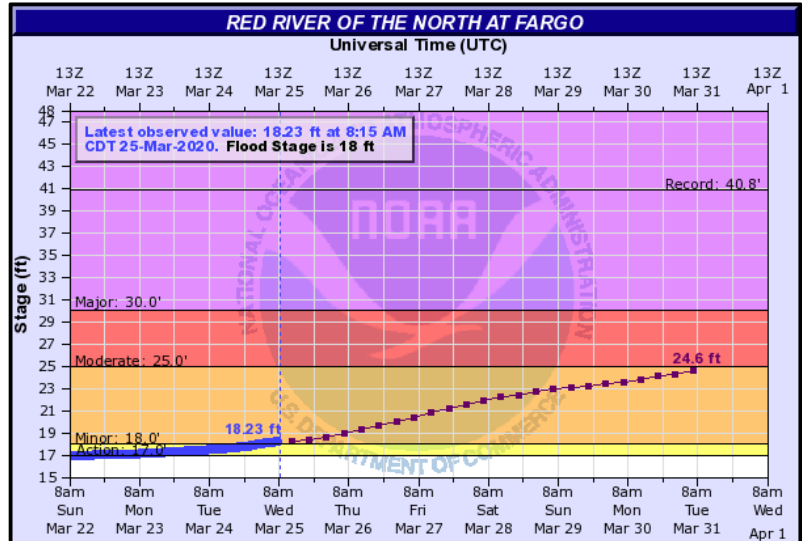

Spring Flood Outlook

- Last year parts of Iowa and Nebraska saw record-breaking flooding. Now the National Weather Service has released their outlook for spring flooding in 2020.
- While the forecast puts many states at moderate to major risk, it looks like most of Nebraska and Iowa are only at minor risk this spring.
- While this new data is promising, minor flooding cannot be ruled out.
- "The key thing that we still have to keep into consideration is the fact, the ground is still saturated," KMTV Chief Meteorologist Jennifer Zeppelin said. "All that moisture that we ended up with from last year, didn't really go anywhere. So the ground moisture content is still pretty deep and still pretty moist."
- That means that if the spring rain is heavy, we could see flooding in vulnerable areas.
- The National Weather Service says the Red River is starting to climb in the Fargo-Moorhead area as the slow thaw process continues.
- The "Red" is expected to reach flood stage in the coming days and top 22 feet by early next week. Flood stage in Fargo is 18. The floodwaters will eventually make their way north towards Grand Forks.



COVID-19 Update

- There were 53,740 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the U.S. as of Tuesday night, with more than 700 deaths, according to data compiled by Johns Hopkins University. The U.S. has the third-highest number of reported cases in the world, behind China and Italy.
- New York continues to be the epicenter of the outbreak in the U.S., with more than 25,000 cases of COVID-19, most of them in New York City. At least 210 people have died.
- Oklahoma and Wisconsin became the last states to tell their residents to stay at home or shelter in place, bringing the total to 18 states issuing similar orders.
- The World Health Organization said Tuesday that the United States has the potential to become the new epicenter of the coronavirus pandemic. "We are now seeing a very large acceleration in cases in the U.S. So it does have that potential," WHO spokeswoman Dr. Margaret Harris told reporters, according to Reuters.
- The number of cases reported globally was at 417,966 Tuesday night. At least 18,600 people have died and more than 104,000 have recovered.
