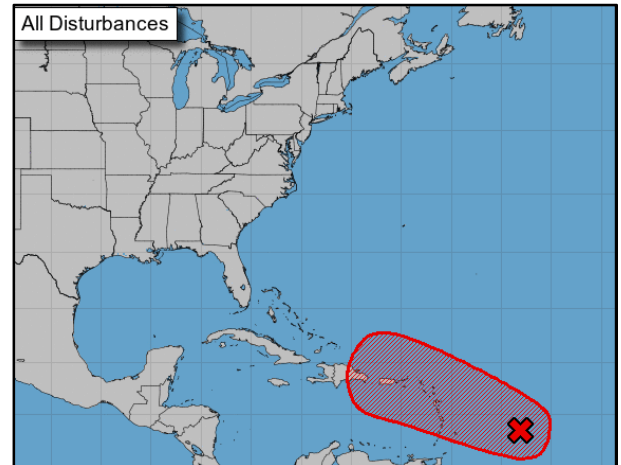

## Tropical Activity

### Atlantic – Disturbance 1 (Invest 92L)

- Located 500 miles E of the Windward Islands moving WNW at 15-20 mph
- Environmental conditions expected to become somewhat more conducive for development; a tropical depression or tropical storm likely to form during the next couple of days
- Locally heavy rain and gusty winds likely across portions of the Leeward Islands on Wednesday and will spread westward to the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico Wednesday night and Thursday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (80%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)



### Atlantic – Remnants of Hanna

- Hanna was 65 miles north of Fresnillo in the Mexican state of Zacatecas and its remnants still threatened to bring rainfall and flash flooding to waterlogged parts of South Texas and Northern Mexico.
- Texas Gov. Greg Abbott on Tuesday will survey the damage left by Hurricane Hanna along the South Texas Coast and Rio Grande Valley.
- Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño Jr., the county's top elected official, said there were reports of at least 150 flooded homes and some roadways were still impassable due to high water, but for the most part the county was doing well.
- Across northern Cameron County and Willacy County, the storm's winds, peaking at about 63 mph in Harlingen, damaged homes and downed power lines but wreaked little flooding in low-lying, flood-prone areas, officials said.
- By Monday evening, 50,600 customers remained without power throughout South Texas, including Corpus Christi, Harlingen and McAllen, utility officials said.

### East Pacific – Tropical Cyclone Douglas (FINAL)

- Currently 460 miles WNW of Honolulu, HI moving WNW at 14 mph; maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 125 miles
- The last remaining warning was lifted early Monday, and Hurricane Douglas continued to move away from Hawaii after skirting to the north of the state overnight and leaving only minor damage.
- Heavy rain and strong winds came in waves on Maui and Molokai, but there was no major damage.
