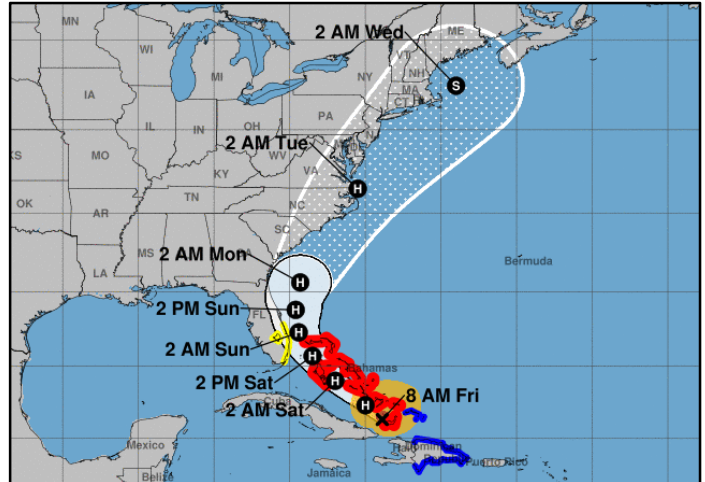

July 31, 2020

Tropical Activity

Atlantic – Hurricane Isaias

- Isaias, declared a hurricane late Thursday night, had maximum sustained winds of 80 mph Friday morning and was centered about 15 miles south-southwest of Great Inagua Island in the Bahamas.
- Isaias is currently forecast to pass over the southeastern Bahamas early Friday, then head near the central Bahamas late Friday, and move near South Florida Saturday.
- Tropical Storm Watches are now in effect Friday for a lengthy stretch of Florida's southern coastline, from Homestead to Vero Beach.
- Where Isaias will affect the US, and how intense it will be, was still uncertain Friday morning.
- Some forecast models show the storm slowing down and coming very close to the Florida coast Saturday and Sunday before getting near the Carolinas on Monday and Tuesday.
- In contrast, others curve the hurricane away from Florida and directly toward the Carolinas.
- Either way, the storm could affect much of the US East Coast at some point into next week -- potentially bringing winds of tropical-storm strength as far north as Maine by early Wednesday.

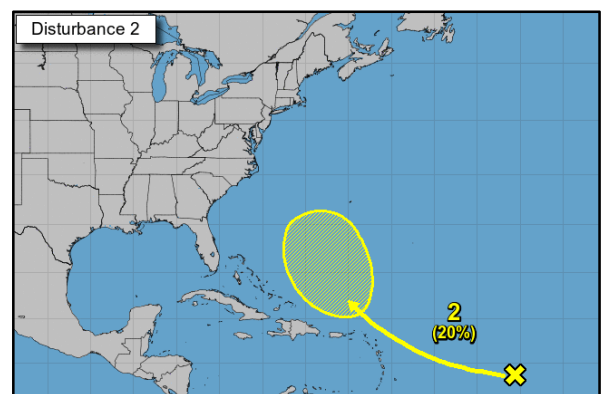


Puerto Rico

- Isaias, which hit the island as a tropical storm, toppled trees, flooded streets and knocked out power for hundreds of thousands of homes and businesses.
- At least 35 people were rescued by the National Guard, according to the Associated Press.
- Flooding and small landslides affected much of the island, but the heaviest impacts were in the southern regions of the U.S. territory.
- Nearly 400,000 customers remained without electricity Friday morning.

Atlantic – Disturbance 2

- A westward-moving tropical wave located about 1000 miles east of the Lesser Antilles is producing a limited amount of shower activity.
- Some slow development of this system is possible while it turns northwestward over the western Atlantic by early next week.
- Formation chance through 48 hours (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days (20%)
