

Fire Activity

<u>Texas</u>

- After a welcome snowfall gave firefighters a brief break Thursday from hot and dry conditions while fighting the largest wildfire in Texas history, firefighters are now facing a return to dangerous fire weather over the weekend.
- A weak area of low pressure swung through the Texas wildfire zones Thursday, bringing about 1-3 inches of snow to the Panhandle, according to the National Weather Service.
- Winds on Saturday will begin to gust up to 40 mph and then will increase slightly on Sunday with gusts up to 50 mph.
- The largest fire burning remains the Smokehouse C reek Fire north of Stinnett, at a Texas record 1.075 million acres and only 3% containment. 700 homes/structures threatened.
- Two fatalities reported.
- Mandatory evacuations: Windy Deuce Fire: 2,300
- Mandatory evacuations: Smokehouse Creek: 3,000
