

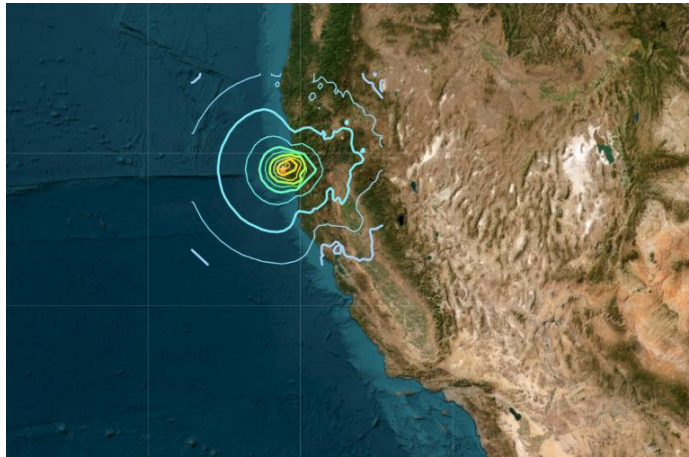

December 20, 2022

Earthquake Activity

- A magnitude 6.4 earthquake shook parts of Northern California early Tuesday, jolting people awake, the U.S. Geological Survey said, and thousands were without power afterward.
- No injuries were immediately reported following the earthquake, which occurred about 2:34 a.m. near Ferndale, a small community in Humboldt County.
- More than a dozen smaller earthquakes, known as aftershocks, struck the area after the 6.4 magnitude quake, according to the USGS, including a 4.6 magnitude quake.
- Approximately 71,000 customers are currently without power in Humboldt County, according to poweroutage.us, which tracks outages across the country. That's 71% of the customers in the county.
- Residents in the area have been posting video showing the damage to their homes. There are reports of gas leaks in the area and at least one bridge has a large crack through it.



Severe Weather Outlook

- From Thursday to Friday, the central barometric pressure of the storm has the potential to crash as fast as some hurricanes that experience rapid intensification.
- As the pressure plummets, winds will rush in and swirl at high speeds around the storm's center.
- The winds will allow moisture to be drawn in from the Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic and cold air to be dragged southeastward from the Arctic.
- The result will be nothing short of blizzard conditions in many Midwest states including Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska and Missouri.
- A blizzard is officially defined by the National Weather Service as blowing and/or falling snow with winds of at least 35 mph that reduce the visibility to a quarter of a mile or less for at least three hours.
