

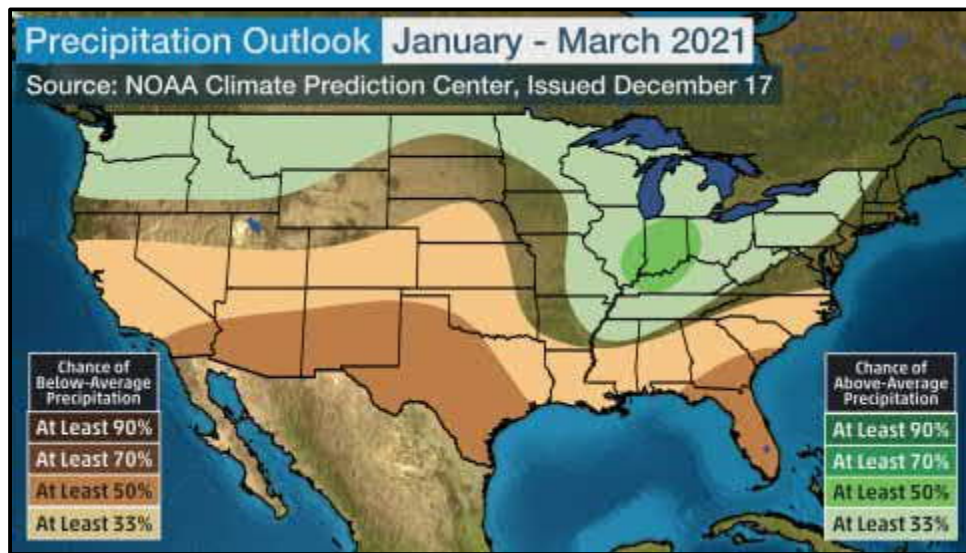

January 12, 2021

2021 Spring Flood Outlook

- Dry conditions currently throughout North Dakota and southern Saskatchewan have resulted in an extremely low spring runoff outlook, according to the National Weather Service.
- Similarly, dry conditions throughout the Missouri River Basin could lead to less than normal runoff into Lake Sakakawea.
- The NWS says the “overall flood risk within the Souris River Basin is very minimal” through the forecast period extending into late March.
- Primarily, the NWS cites “a lack of significant snowpack, dry soils, and a lack of large storm events in the near-term forecast” making for a low probability of high water in the Souris River in the coming months.
- The dryness and growing drought conditions are now sprouting concerns 2021 could produce a similar weather pattern to 2012.
- The National Weather Service will issue an updated spring flood outlook in February.
