Tropical Activity

Atlantic – Tropical Storm Nicole

- Nicole made landfall in Florida as a hurricane early Thursday morning, but its impacts including prolonged coastal flooding, beach erosion, strong winds, high surf, heavy rain and tornadoes will continue to impact other parts of the Southeast as well as the mid-Atlantic and Northeast through the end of the workweek.
- Nicole's center pushed ashore just south of Vero Beach, Florida, at 3 a.m. EST. Its maximum sustained winds were 75 mph, making Nicole a Category 1 hurricane.
- Nicole was just the fourth November hurricane to landfall in the mainland U.S. in records dating to the mid-19th century, and the first to do so in 37 years.
- Now that Nicole is inland, it has weakened back to a strong tropical storm.
- Radar shows bands of soaking rain rotating across northern and central Florida this morning.
- A tornado watch is in effect until 1 p.m. ET for northeast Florida and far southeast Georgia.
- Winds have have gusted 70 mph or greater on Florida's Atlantic coast, including in Playalinda Beach (77 mph), Cape Canaveral (75 mph), Melbourne (70 mph) and Daytona Beach (70 mph). Wind gusts over 60 mph have been clocked in Orlando.
- A NOAA tide gauge reported major coastal flooding this morning at Port Canaveral, Florida, from a storm surge of over 5 feet.
- Tropical storm warnings are in effect for a broad area of southern, central and northern Florida, southern Georgia and the South Carolina Lowcountry.
- Cities in the tropical storm warnings include Orlando, Fort Myers, Tampa and Tallahassee in Florida as well as Savannah, Georgia and Charleston, South Carolina.
- A storm surge warning is in effect from Jupiter Inlet, Florida, to Glynn County, Georgia, a stretch of the St. Johns River in northeast Florida from Georgetown to where it empties into the Atlantic Ocean north of Jacksonville Beach, and along a part of Florida's Gulf Coast from Pasco County north to Wakulla County.
- Nicole is forecast to continue weakening today as it curls northwestward over Florida.
- Mandatory evacuation orders were in place for parts of at least three counties, dozens of school districts and universities canceled classes, and airports and theme parks closed.
- Orlando International Airport, which shut down on Wednesday, remained closed early Thursday. Other airports in Florida, including those in Tampa, Jacksonville and Palm Beach, were reporting cancellations and delays.
- Nicole has knocked out power to almost 320,00 homes and businesses in Florida, according to poweroutage.us. Brevard County has been hit the hardest.

Severe Weather & Tornado Activity

Oklahoma

- Governor Kevin Stitt declared a State of Emergency Saturday, November 5th, for Bryan, Choctaw, Le Flore and McCurtain counties due to severe storms, tornadoes, and straight-line winds that swept through southeastern Oklahoma on Friday, November 4th.
- The National Weather Service has upgraded last week's tornado that hit Idabel to an EF-4. NWS officials said the tornado was the first EF-4 to hit Oklahoma since May 9, 2016.
- According to The Red Cross's assessment in Bryan, Choctaw, and McCurtain counties 241 homes have been affected, 21 of them are destroyed and 22 have major damage.
