Tropical Activity

Tropical Depression Five

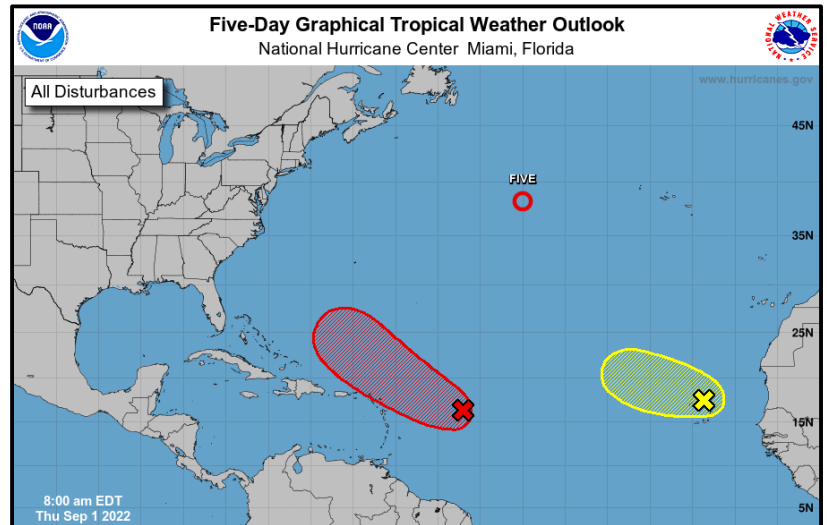
- Located 975 miles W of the Azores moving ENE at 2 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Forecast to become a tropical storm later today
- Expected to stay out at sea and not impact U.S. mainland.

Disturbance 1 (91L)

- Located several hundred miles E of the Leeward Islands
- Although conditions are only marginally conducive, any additional development over the next few days would lead to the formation of a tropical depression
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Medium (60%); 5-days: High (80%)

Disturbance 2

- Located over and to the NW of the Cabo Verde Islands
- There is still potential for it to become a short-lived tropical depression during the next day or so
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Low (30%); 5-days: Low (30%)



Declaration Request

Illinois

- U.S. Representative Mike Bost (IL-12), along with the entire Illinois Congressional delegation, sent a letter to President Biden requesting that Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) provide federal assistance to the State of Illinois to help St. Clair County respond to significant damage from the flash floods on July 26.
- In their letter, the lawmakers laid out the severity of the storm, which forced more than 20 Metro East families to evacuate.
- "On July 26, a historic storm in the area resulted in eight to 12 inches of rain in a mere 12 hours, causing the evacuation of more than 20 families, road closures, and widespread flood damage. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) worked with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and the County to assess more than 700 homes reporting damage."
- "We respectfully request that you approve Governor Pritzker's request for Individual Assistance for St. Clair County," the lawmakers concluded.
